## Endorsements



The Indiana School of Ministry (ISOM) has been recognized and endorsed by the Executive Presbytery Board of the General Council of the Assemblies of God as a member of the Association of Assemblies of God District Schools of Ministry. The School has also been endorsed by the Executive Presbytery of the Indiana District Council of the Assemblies of God as an official ministerial training program for those seeking credentials through the Indiana District Council of the Assemblies of God.

Courses completed through the Indiana School of Ministry that are required by the Assemblies of God for credentials meet the educational requirements of the General Council for the respective level of credential.

Completion of the courses, however, does not guarantee that a ministry credential will be granted, nor that preferential treatment will be given to those completing the required ministerial training courses through the School of Ministry. The credentialing of ministers is a process separate from completion of the educational requirements.

ISOM is a non-accredited Bible institute. While endorsed by the Executive Presbyter of the General Council of the Assemblies of God for ministerial training, courses completed through the school do not automatically qualify for college credit.

## Registration

- Enrollment is open to students 18 years of age and older who have openly confessed Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. **No children are allowed.**
- To register, go to the ISOM website [www.indianaag.org/isom-english](http://www.indianaag.org/isom-english).
- Click on the “Register for Classes” button.
- Enrollment - \$30 (one time fee per level/certificate)
- Tuition - \$125 per course
- Textbooks, travel, food, and lodging - Student’s cost
- Students should enroll and register online no less than one month prior to the beginning of the scheduled course. All late registrations (ten days after registration has closed) will incur a late fee of \$20.
- Registration is required for each course. Multiple courses can be registered for at the same time. Once a student registers for a class, within 24 hours he/she will be enrolled in the Moodle class.
- A student may start at any point during the school year.
- Courses may be audited for a fee of \$50 per course as classroom space allows. Those who audit a course must complete the Audit Registration form online **PRIOR** to attending the class. Permission to audit will be granted after the closure of the regular registration period (three weeks before class) and will end on the Monday before class or as stated in deadline reminder.

## Textbooks

- It is not mandatory for a student to purchase their textbook(s) through Christianbook.com, as a textbook can be purchased through Amazon or another vendor. Christianbook.com, does, however, provide a discount to the students.
- Occasionally there is a textbook that needs to be ordered through ISOM. In that instance, a student may either purchase at the time of registration or go to the “Student Services” section and click on the “ISOM Bookstore” button to purchase. If there is a manual required for the course, the cost will be added into the registration fee.
- For a full list of textbooks for the entire school year, simply click on the “Textbooks” button to download and/or print the list.

## Grades

- Students must receive a passing grade of at least 70 (C-) in order to receive credit for a course.
- Final grades are based upon the following criteria:
  - 20% - Life Application Forum (LAF)
  - 40% - Study Guide
  - 40% - Final Exam
- Final Exams are created from the Study Guide. However, not every question on the Study Guide will appear on the Final Exam.
- Final Exams may include true/false, multiple choice, matching, and word fill-in.



## What does an ISOM weekend look like?

ISOM courses are conducted once a month, nine times a year and are taken at Indianapolis Lakeview Church on Saturdays, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

### Prior to arrival, each student:

- Reads the textbook(s) and completes the Study Guide and the Life Application Forum (LAF). A minimum of 15-20 hours of pre-class preparatory work is necessary. However, students may invest a total of 20-25 hours per course.
- Reviews the detailed information regarding the ISOM event that is emailed the Monday before the weekend.
- Studies the Study Guide in preparation for the exam and completes the Life Application Forum (LAF).

## LEVEL ONE

### **The Life of Christ** **CERT 101**

This course will concentrate on major events in the life of Christ, focusing on the time, place, circumstances, and people involved in the Lord's ministry. The goal of this class is to increase students' understanding of the Lord's message, ministry, and mission; inspiring them to be better ministers of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

### **Introduction to Pentecostal Doctrine** **CERT 102**

This is a study on the fundamental truths of the Assemblies of God. Special emphasis is given to the four cardinal doctrines of the Assemblies of God; Salvation, the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, Healing, and the Second Coming of Christ.

### **Introduction to Hermeneutics** **CERT 105**

An introduction to methods of Bible study, with special attention given to basic principles of scriptural interpretation, especially for personal edification.

### **AG History, Missions, and Governance** **CERT 107**

A study of the historical development and governing policies of the Assemblies of God, its history in America and its worldwide missions program. Includes a study of the ecclesiastical structure of the Assemblies of God, with particular attention to the General Council Constitution and Bylaws in relation to credentialed ministers, local churches, district councils, the General Council, and doctrines and practices that are approved or disapproved.

### **Relationships and Ethics in Ministry** **CERT 108**

This course offers a biblical evaluation of the need for accountability and integrity in the minister's personal and professional relationships. Relationships and ethics are examined in view of the minister's personal and family life, church constituents, leadership, and the greater community.

### **Spirit Empowered Churches** **CERT 110**

This class will provide a foundation for servant and spiritual leadership, following Jesus' example, in the context of the local church. This class will also include a study of dynamic church growth as portrayed in the Acts 2 church model: creating Spirit-empowered disciples who are involved in purposeful activities to change individuals, families, and communities with the love and power of God's Holy Spirit.

### **New Testament Survey** **CERT 111**

This course will serve as an introduction to the history, literature, and basic message of the New Testament. The course will address major figures, events, and themes of the New Testament books.

### **Old Testament Survey** **CERT 112**

This course will serve as an introduction to the history, literature, and basic message of the Old Testament. The course will address major figures, events, and themes of the Old Testament and its foundational relationship to the New Testament.

### **Introduction to Theology** **CERT 113**

A study of the meaning and purpose of theology and historic Christian doctrines as expressed in Protestant and Evangelical traditions.

### **Certified Internship**

All students who plan to apply for ministerial credentials must go through an internship. Internships may be done through the Indiana School of Ministry or Berean School of the Bible. ## LEVEL TWO

### **Romans** **LIC 204**

This course provides a practical study of Paul's letter to the Romans. It deals with the background of the book and its relationship to the rest of the Pauline writings.

### **Introduction to Homiletics** **LIC 205**

A study in the development, preparation, and delivery of sermons, with special emphasis on expository preaching.

### **Eschatology** **LIC 206**

An advanced study of the doctrine of the End Times. This study includes the following topics: death and the intermediate state, resurrection and rapture, views of the tribulation, the millennial reign of Christ, divine judgment and the final state of the righteous and the wicked.

### **Introduction to AG Missions** **LIC 207**

This is an introductory course in the science of missions. It surveys the theology, history and methods of Christian missions, in general, and within the Assemblies of God. There is a special emphasis on the role of the Holy Spirit in missions today.

### **Effective Leadership** **LIC 208**

This course provides a biblical approach to the principles of leadership, applying those principles in the church setting and giving students practical skills needed to serve in a leadership role in the local church.

### **Conflict Management** **LIC 209**

A study devoted to the resolution of conflict in the local church. The reasons for churches becoming unhealthy and how God wants to heal them are examined. The lordship of Jesus Christ and His methodology in resolving conflict form the basis of this study.

### **Acts** **LIC 210**

This course is a study of the biblical theology of Acts with an emphasis on the historical development of the church and the continuing supernatural role of the Holy Spirit in the church.

### **The Local Church in Evangelism** **LIC 211**

A practical study of the Great Commission of sharing the Gospel with the world, both personally and in cooperation with other believers.

### **Prison Epistles** **LIC 212**

This course is a practical study of the letters that Paul wrote to the churches while in prison. Emphasis is placed on doctrine and personal lifestyle application from these books.

### **Licensed Internship**

All students who plan to apply for ministerial credentials must go through an internship. Internships may be done through the Indiana School of Ministry or Berean School of the Bible. ## LEVEL THREE

### **Theology of Worship** **ORD 301**

An introduction to the power of corporate and individual worship as it pertains to experiencing His presence daily.

### **Corinthians** **ORD 302**

This course considers Paul's responses to the problems that afflicted the Corinthian church and examines the appropriate operation of the gifts of the Spirit within the congregation.

### **The Pentateuch** **ORD 303**

A study of the first five books of the Bible. Issues related to the Law, creation, the Exodus, and the Abrahamic covenant are addressed. Attention is given to the tabernacle, the patriarchs, and the early history of Israel.

### **The Poetic Books** **ORD 304**

This course is a study of the Poetic Books of the Old Testament (Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon). It emphasizes Hebrew poetry and its relation to other biblical texts as well as its practical application in the life of the contemporary believer.

### **Preaching in Cultural Context** **ORD 305**

The purpose of this course is to help preachers preach life-changing messages that connect with the world around them. The course will focus on presenting messages that are true, clear, interesting, and relevant. Students will be challenged to present messages that are true to the intent and power of Scripture, as well as relevant to the needs and concerns of this audience.

### **Pastoral Ministry** **ORD 307**

This course provides a study of the practical aspects of the ministry: The pastor as a divinely called servant, a Spirit-filled leader, a preacher, a teacher, a counselor, and administrator, and as a spouse and parent.

### **Church Leadership** **ORD 308**

A study of the systems, structures, and functions of church leadership. This class will walk through the necessity of connecting with the presence of God for divine revelation, reviewing the importance of passion and inspiration in church leadership, creating plans and processes within the church structure to advance God's vision for a local church and community.

### **Theology of Prayer** **ORD 309**

A study of biblical prayer, stressing the importance and impact of prayer in contemporary life and ministry.

### **Church Administration and Law** **ORD 310**

A theological and practical study of the wide-ranging daily life issues of running a church - organizational, financial, legal, and people issues.

### **Ordained Internship**

## CERTIFICATE IN BIBLICAL STUDIES

### **The Pentateuch ORD 303**

A study of the first five books of the Bible. Issues related to the Law, creation, the Exodus, and the Abrahamic covenant are addressed. Attention is given to the tabernacle, the patriarchs, and the early history of Israel.

### **Acts LIC 210**

This course is a study of the biblical theology of Acts with an emphasis on the historical development of the church and the continuing supernatural role of the Holy Spirit in the church.

### **Romans LIC 204**

This course provides a practical study of Paul's letter to the Romans. It deals with the background of the book and its relationship to the rest of the Pauline writings.

### **The Life of Christ CERT 101**

# WORSHIP CERTIFICATE

## Worship Theology

### WM 101

In this class we will be covering the basics of worship. We will be going over the concept of being both "filled and skilled" to lead our congregations and why worship is important, not only in our churches, but in our own lives as well. Emphasis will be placed on remembering our purpose and calling, and we will be strengthened together with not only the "why" of worship, but the renewed focus of it in our lives.

This is a great class for all who have a worshiper's heart. There will be a Q&A session, resource sharing, and a time of prayer together.

## Worship Systems I

### WM102

We will begin looking at the mechanics, the "skilled" part, of leading worship. We will touch on many different aspects of leading such as song selection, establishing key signatures, learning how to "flow," creating set-lists, and the mechanics of leading a congregation.

This is a great class for the beginner or the experienced worship leader. There will be a Q&A session, resource sharing, and a time of prayer together.

## Worship Systems II

### WM 103

In this class, we will continue learning and going over the mechanics of leading worship. Systems 2 will build on the "Worship Systems 1" class with new material and reviewing what we have learned so far. Both Systems 1 and 2 will cover the actual working mechanics of leading worship: the actual "how-to".

This is a great class for the beginner or the experienced worship leader. There will be a Q&A session, resource sharing, and a time of prayer together.

## Relationships in Worship

### WM 104

The focus for this awesome class will be on relationships: relationships with your pastors, relationships with your teams, relationships with your congregation, and your own relationship with the Heavenly Father. The Bible says to love the Lord your God with all your heart/mind/soul/strength, and the second commandment is to love others. You will learn and be reminded in this class of the importance of serving and loving your congregation. You will also gain helpful insights on how to handle a team of varied personalities, and how to relate to your congregation as you lead.

There will be a Q&A session, resource sharing, and a time of prayer together.

## Holiness in Worship

### WM 105

In this final class, we will focus on the "filled" part of being filled and skilled for leading worship. As the leader, it is vitally important to live our lives with "no parts dark", and to place our highest priority on holiness before God. We will talk about personal holiness and team holiness, as well as taking time in this class to learn how to flow with the Holy Spirit in our services. This class would also benefit all those with a worshiper's heart, anyone wanting more of the Lord, and all who hunger for His presence in their lives and churches.

There will be a Q&A session, resource sharing, and a time of prayer together.

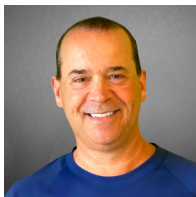
