Shorter BCM was on mission over the Christmas Break as a team of 11 was sharing "Good News" with the people of Covington, KY. We were working with South Side Baptist Church and their inner-city ministries. Shorter students led worship, Bible studies & activities with children & youth. Churches from the Northern KY Baptist Association donated food & Christmas gifts for families and our mission team helped in handing these out to the over 100 families. This mission trip always reminds us of the true meaning of Christmas as we celebrate the birth of the one who is "Good News."

In January, the BCM begins a training for discipleship leaders. These leaders will lead their own groups next fall! We have two students attending SendMeNow interviews for summer missions this coming weekend. (Jan. 7-9) Also, in March, we are sending a mission team to our new partnership Utah/Idaho Convention. (March 4-12) This will be a team of 12! Dr. Lucas Butler, professor of Evangelism & Missions, is helping to lead this team with David Roland. He is utilizing this mission trip in his Missions class he is teaching this semester as we will be utilizing activities/ministries on our campus in preparation for our time in Utah!

## **CCM SPOTLIGHT**



Cindy Brock has been the Director of the Church and Community Missions ministry at the Floyd County Baptist Association since October 2014; however, she has volunteered at the FCBA since 1995. Cindy has a heart for helping others. Her compassionate spirit and empathetic demeanor are exactly what those who come to the FCBA for assistance are in need of. Whether they are in need of food, help with toys for their children at Christmas, or if she is at the Coosa Valley Fair helping to feed the fair workers as they are setting up rides - Cindy finds joy and hope in each situation, and manages to pass that on to the person she is talking with.

The CCM has five different serving ministries that are here to assist the people in our community. Those ministries include:

- 1) Food Pantry. The Food Pantry provides boxes of food for Floyd County residents, by appointment only, on Tuesday and Thursday mornings at 9:30 a.m. While the clients are waiting for their food boxes to be prepared for them, they attend a Bible Study led by a local pastor.
- 2) Backpacks of Love: There are times when Floyd County DFCS needs to take custody of a child and picks them up directly from school or hospital where they do not have the opportunity to get any personal items from their home. When this happens, all the child has is what is on their back. The Backpacks of Love help the foster family provide the basic necessities until they can get to the store to get appropriate items for the child.
- 3) Prison hygiene bags: Hygiene bags are delivered to the prison on Blacks Bluff Road. In addition to a basic hygiene bag a black comb, white socks, paper, envelopes and pencils are included. These bags are distributed to prisoners who are housed at this facility.
- 4) Feeding the Coosa Valley Fair workers: On the Monday before the fair starts in October at the Coosa Valley Fairgrounds, the CCM ministry, along with assistance from FCBA churches, approximately 200 fair workers are fed. In addition to being fed a nice hot meal they are also given Bibles and hygiene bags. A service in both English and Spanish is held at the fairgrounds for the workers. These workers travel all over the country and stated they always look forward to coming back to Rome, as this is the only place that reaches out to them in such a loving way.
- 5) Christmas Toy Store: This ministry assists parents or grandparents with custody of their children in providing gifts at Christmas. Applications are taken in early November for this assistance. The parent/guardian must be able to provide their ID, the child's social security card, proof of address and proof of income. At this meeting, they are given an appointment time to return in December to shop for their kid's toys. In mid November, approximately 10 people go to Walmart to shop for the items on the list. The toys purchased generally fill up a church bus, thanks to the generous donations of FCBA churches and private individuals. When the parent or guardian returns in early December, they are assisted by a volunteer to select three toys for each child. They are also given a stocking (donated by a FCBA church) and a Chick-Fil-A card for nuggets or a sandwich (donated by Truett's CFA on Shorter Avenue).

While Cindy does a fantastic job in her role as the CCM Director, it takes numerous volunteers to help with the various ministries. 

## GEORGIA BAPTIST CONVENTION UPDATE

I attended the Executive Committee meeting in Macon on December 14, the following are highlights of this session:

- Chairman of the Executive Committee appointed members for a committee on prevention of sexual abuse (no active cases at present).
- The Georgia Healthcare Foundation will pay the retirement stipend for retirees. The GHCF cannot make payments to individuals. They will send the money to the GBMB and GBMB will distribute the funds to retirees.
- 100 churches left the GBC this year.
- GBMB will fall short of their budged to least by \$2.3 million this year.
- The average Georgia Baptist church gives only 3.7% to the Cooperative program.
- Sugarloaf campus buyers continue to pursue closing. Because of County Commission requirement, the closing may be end of summer 2022.
- Josh Saefkow was elected Chairman of the Executive Committee.
- Emir Canter, President of Truett McConnell, asked for forgiveness for remarks he made at our November convention.
- The Executive Committee passed a resolution to continue the talks with 4 Stones concerning BCM. 4 Stones (owned by the Cathy's) want to partner with us on 6 college campuses. For example, the UGA campus ministry building is in disrepair (also needs a \$1.8 boiler) GMBM does not have those funds. 4 Stones wants to demolish and rebuild on GBMB property; give us one floor rent free; pay us another percentage of revenue they recovered from retail and student housing in the new building. We would sign a 99-year lease on the property (dirt) we own. On 6 campuses, 4 Stones wants to invest \$105 million on the 6 campuses and build a total of 485,000 square feet.
- A task committee, appointed by Josh Saefkow, to study the possibility of keeping more of the Corporate Program contribution in Georgia.
