Would you be willing to lift these students and many others up in prayer for the rest of the summer?

In March, The BCM & Christian Studies majors joined together to help churches in Logan, Utah. Utah is the U.S. partner for Northwest Georgia. Our students were able to experience what an unreached people group is like right here in the United States. Logan, Utah is one of several cities that is less than 1% evangelical Christian. As a result of this spring break mission trip, two students felt God calling them to go back and work with Valley Baptist Church in Logan. PRAYING FOR OUR NEIGHBORS



We are PRAYING people. One of our goals is to pray for every home/family in Rome and Floyd County. We are asking every pastor, every church, every member to pray for their neighbors. The online tool we are using to accomplish this is called “**Bless Every Home**”. Below is a simple step-by-step process to guide you through signing up and to begin praying for 5 of your neighbors every day.

- 1 - Go to <https://blesseveryhome.com/> and click on the sign up tab.
- 2 - Create an account (you will not pay for anything, this is **FREE**) by answering the questions. You will need to provide a current/active email address (because this is how you will receive your daily reminder to pray for 5 of your neighbors).
- 3 - Once you have created an account, you will have a “dashboard”. It is on this dashboard that you can adjust the settings on the areas that you want to pray for and the number of neighbors.
- 4 - Every day you will get an email with the names and addresses of your 5 neighbors to pray for with a different scripture to pray for them. Once you have prayed for them, simply click on the “prayed” tab.
- 5 - You may even want to use this as a guide as you prayer walk your neighborhood, or write a short note to your neighbors introducing yourself and let them know you are praying for them.

The main speaker in the inspirational rally will be Sam Greer. Sam grew up as a stutterer and still deals with episodes of stuttering. As a result, Sam was terrified to speak in public and intimidated to carry on a conversation. Due to his fear of public speaking, one of the last classes he took in college was the required public speaking class. Nonetheless, God called Sam to what he feared the most, that is, a lifetime of public speaking. Eight years into pastoring, Sam realized God had called him to "do the work of an evangelist." Sure, he was proclaiming the gospel from the pulpit, at funerals and weddings, during counseling sessions, and pastoral visits; however, Sam was not having gospel conversations in his everyday life. The Holy Spirit convicted him to repent of not having gospel conversations, face his fear of having gospel conversations, and lead the local church to cultivate a culture of having gospel conversations. Sam has served as a local pastor in an SBC church since 2004.

After pastoring two congregations in Louisiana, he was led to Red Bank Baptist Church in Chattanooga, Tennessee, where he has served as senior pastor since 2012. He received a Bachelor of Arts from Millsaps College, Master of Divinity, Master of Theology, and a Doctor of Philosophy from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. He is the author of "The Gospel Conversation," "The Gospel Conversationalist," and "The Gospel Conversational Church." Sam and his wife, Tonya, have two daughters: Braydee and Belle.

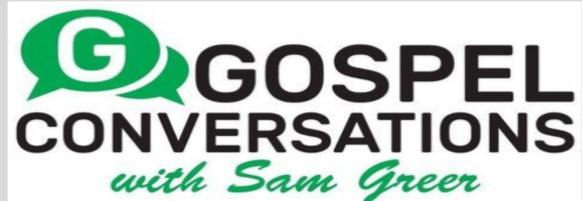
