# TIM'S TOP THREE



We are halfway through 2024. This time of year we begin the process of evaluating our current plans and budget in preparation for the coming year. As I do my work on the budget all I want to say is THANK YOU! First, I praise God because if it were not for Him we would not be experiencing the blessings that we are enjoying. Second, I am so thankful for the generosity of our pastors and people. In the first part of 2024 we have

received \$134,076.98 toward the annual budget goal. At the present time we are \$8,730.23 ahead of our budget goal. Thank you for your giving and support. When I came to the FCBA in 2021 our budget goal was \$214,364.00 and this year it is \$300,832.23. In three years the churches of the FCBA have increased their giving to missions through the association by \$84,468.23 or 40.3%! Praise The Lord!

Great things are happening, but we have got so much more to do. So please do not stop giving to missions through the FCBA. Remember our mission is..." encouraging and equipping pastors and people to do the Great Commandment and the Great Commission" and our nine priorities are..." praying, reaching, discipling, going, caring, growing, training, giving, and next gen".

Please look through this newsletter and you will see we are focused on our mission and seeking to address our nine priorities. It is important that you share the information included in this newsletter with the appropriate leaders in your church.

This is not a list of everything we are doing, but it is my TOP THREE.

- Provide guidance from a leader who has gone through a similar hurt, hangup, or habit.
- Provide the opportunity to find an accountability partner or sponsor.
- Provide the opportunity to find community and freedom from the issues that are controlling our lives.

# DISASTER RELIEF INTRODUCTION (DRI)

Disaster Relief Introduction (DRI) is required for all first-time volunteers and all Georgia Baptist Disaster Relief Volunteers needing recertification.

The DRI consists of two sessions:

Session 1 - Friday night (6 - 9 pm) This is an introduction to the ministry of Disaster Relief.

Session 2 - Saturday morning (8 - 10 am or 8 am - 12 pm for Chaplaincy) Training in the specific ministry area. During the online registration, choose from one of following Primary Ministry Areas:

1. Chaplaincy; 2. Cleanup & Recovery; 3. Family Care; 4. Feeding; 5. Shower Units

NOTE: During the online registration, you have the opportunity to register to cross train in an additional ministry area on Saturday from 10 am - 12pm. However, if training in Chaplaincy, you will NOT be able to cross train on Saturday from 10 am - 12 pm.

Online registration is easy:

- 1. Click the link below for the introduction you want to register for.
- 2. If this is the first time you have registered online, click the "Don't have an account? Sign Up" to the right of the "Sign In" button.
- 3. Complete the information and click "Create an Account".
- 4. You will receive an email with the information to activate your account and register for the event.

To remain an active, credentialed Disaster Relief volunteer, recertification in your Primary Ministry Area/Primary Unit Assignment is required every 5 years. Recertification in your Primary Ministry Area will recertify you in all areas you are trained in. Check the expiration date on your ID badge to know when you need to recertify. There are 2 OPTIONS to recertify: 1. Attend a DRI or 2. Attend a state-wide yearly recertification event.

Recertification consists of 2 sessions (both sessions must be completed to recertify):

Session 1 - Friday night (6 - 9pm) This is an update to the ministry of Disaster Relief and is included in the DRI. \*Session 2 - Saturday morning (8 -10 am) Recertification in your Primary Ministry Area/Primary Unit Assignment. During the online registration, choose your current Primary Ministry Area/Primary Unit Assignment:

1. Chaplaincy; 2. Cleanup & Recovery; 3. Family Care; 4. Feeding; 5. Shower Units

\*If your Primary Unit Assignment is Assessment or IMT, Session 2 on Saturday will be as follows: Assessment: Session 2 - Saturday morning (8 am - 12 pm) IMT: Session 2 - Saturday morning (8 am - 12 pm)

### **NOTES:**

- 1. If you are recertifying and your Primary Ministry Area is Cleanup & Recovery, Family Care, Feeding, or Shower Units, during the online registration, you have the opportunity to register to cross train in an additional ministry area on Saturday from 10 am - 12 pm. (Additional fee applies.)
- 2. If you are recertifying and your Primary Ministry Area is Assessment, Chaplaincy, or IMT, you will NOT be able to cross train in an additional area on Saturday.


The number of messengers for your church is determined through the guidance of the FCBA Constitution and Bylaws.

Article VI. Annual Session - Second and Third paragraphs states...

"The Annual Session shall be composed of messengers elected by the churches. Each church which contributes financially to the Association shall be entitled to seven (7) messengers, and any such church having more than one hundred (100) members shall be entitled to one (1) additional messenger for each fifty (50) members over one hundred (100), provided that no church shall have more than fifteen (15) messengers." "Any church, which gives at least 3% of undesignated receipts to the association budget, shall be entitled to at least 10 messengers (additional messengers shall follow the guidelines above). The determining factor for the % of undesignated receipts calculation will come from the undesignated receipts reported by the church on the previous year's ACP."

We will be mailing a letter to the pastors in July to help with the number of messengers.
