We had the FCBA Annual Meeting on Monday night following the SPARK Conference. WE originally planned to have it at the FCBA Center, but the crowd grew to be too large, so we moved to Shorter Avenue Baptist Church. Thanks to pastor Jeremy Albright and the fine folks of Shorter Avenue for hosting us. Here is a quick summary of the day. We had 23 churches represented with a total attendance of 91. In the business session we made some significant changes to our constitution and bylaws and approved a budget of \$309,824 for 2025. That is an increase of \$8,992.02 over the 2024 budget and a monthly requirement of \$25,818.69. Plus, we elected new officers: Eric Whelchel, Pastor, First Baptist Church - Lindale, as Moderator; Jarrod Kinsey, Pastor, First Baptist Church - Cave Spring, as Moderator-Elect; Jean Stanley, member of Spring Creek Baptist Church, as Assistant Treasurer; and Sheri Cordle, member of Antioch Baptist Church, as the FCBA Clerk.

At the Annual Meeting we also heard reports from many of our ministry areas and approved the reports from all teams and committees. It was a busy night! We saw our mission statement..."encouraging and equipping pastors and people to do the Great Commandment and the Great Commission" and our nine priorities... "praying, reaching, discipling, going, caring, (continued on pg. 2)

DAY 8 Sustaining the Mission


