TIM'S TOP THREE



2 Corinthians 5:17 says, ***"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."*** Aren't you glad, aren't you thankful that we have been made NEW because of Christ! I'm thankful that we don't have to live in the past, our sin that separated us from God has been forgiven. We are NEW in Christ! Yes I'm grateful but I'm still brokenhearted for those that have yet to repent and receive Him! Praise God for 2024 but let's pray for an even better 2025!

#1. The 2024 Annual Church Profile (ACP) from the churches has been finalized and here is a quick summary of The Lord's blessings...

Baptisms

- This year our churches reported 462 baptisms, that's two consecutive years of 400+ baptisms. We've not done that in fifteen years!
- We had 54 churches turn in an Annual Church Profile and 11 reported 0 baptisms. The number of churches reporting 1 or fewer baptisms has decreased again this year.

Worship

- In 2024 the FCBA churches reported 6,545 in average weekly worship attendance. That's an increase of 6% over last year.

Sunday School/Small Groups

- In 2024 our churches reported 3,914 in average weekly Sunday School/Small Group attendance. This is a small increase over last year!

God is blessing in so many ways. Lets keep our eyes on Him and be faithful to the mission He has given to us.

#2. Our next DLife Group starts on Tuesday, February 4th. In a recent survey of 1,000 pastors, 63% said their biggest need is for additional training in how to make disciples. Most ministry leaders understand that the hallmark of a healthy church is how many members are intentionally sharing Christ with others and then guiding those new converts into deeper faith in God.

We have something to assist you and your church with this great need. Every year we have a small group that goes through a process of disciple making that can be used in your church. It's DLife and it's working in churches in Rome/Floyd County as well as all over the world! It is a proven disciple-making process based on the way Jesus made disciples. The new group is for anyone and it's not limited to just pastors. This group will have no more than fifteen members. The goal of this group is for the participants to multiply and begin a group in their church.

**Georgia Baptist Mission Board Executive Committee Report
First Baptist Church, Jonesboro, Georgia
December 10, 2024**

Dear Floyd County Baptists,

Thank you again for the opportunity to serve on your behalf as a part of the Executive Committee of the Georgia Baptist Mission Board. On December 10, 2024, I attended the Executive Committee meeting at FBC Jonesboro. Please make note of the following highlights from this quarter's meeting:

- **Camp Kaleo** – A three-year agreement with Friends of Kaleo to continue operating the camp has been signed. The agreement includes liability protections for the Georgia Baptist Mission Board from any and all future liability issues. We are excited to see the camp continue operation under this new leadership.
- **Organizational** – We approved resolutions certifying Ty Salter as Chief Financial Officer and Andy Childs as Assistant Executive Director.
- **Financial** – The Georgia Baptist Mission Board will finish the year in the black. We also approved the following recommendation from The Financial Services Committee: "The Executive Committee, under the leadership of our executive director, will conduct a comprehensive review of the current plan for facilities and that plan's impact on the budget, ministry effectiveness, and limitations to long term viability of budget and ministry."
- **Baptist Collegiate Ministries Properties** – Five BCM properties remain under contract for redevelopment with CCI. We have terminated contracts with CCI concerning the Georgia State and West Georgia properties, since these are not viable redevelopment options. The Georgia State property is on the market for sale, and we have requested a broker's opinion of value for the West Georgia property. Please note: This does not mean that BCM will become inactive on these campuses. An alternative, less facility dependent, approach to ministry has been undertaken.

If you have any specific questions about any of these issues, please let me know, and I will do my best to answer them to the best of my ability.

* **Thursday, January 16th 10:30am at Fellowship Church** 314 Burnett Ferry Road, SW Rome, GA 30165. Our



guest speaker will be Dr. Steve Parr. In forty plus years of ministry Dr. Parr has assisted thousands of churches in strengthening their ministries by motivating and training leaders through seminars, conferences, preaching, and personal consultations. Steve has served with distinction in local churches as a staff member as well as the interim pastor of fifteen congregations. He is a graduate of Shorter University, has a Master of Divinity Degree in Christian Education from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He served on the Georgia Baptist Mission Board team for many years leading in the areas of Bible Study leader training, Evangelism, Next Gen Ministry, and ultimately on the Executive level providing leadership of a staff of over 175. He recently retired as the Executive Director of the Gwinnett Metro Baptist Network and began a new role at Georgia Baptist as the "Evangelism Strategy Director".

He will be sharing about his latest research, "When They Stray". We've all got parents and grandparents in our churches asking, "I have an adult daughter or son who is out of church, how do I get them back?" As a pastor or ministerial staff member that may be your situation too! In a new FREE online resource from Steve Parr entitled "When They Stray" you'll hear some answers! This 4-part series is based on a national study of adults who grew up in church but became disconnected from the church for a year or more as an adult before making their return. You'll learn what churches did, what God did and what's working in people's lives to get them back into church.

* **Thursday, February 13th 10:30am at Woodlawn Baptist Church** 1649 Cartersville Highway SE Rome, GA 30161. Our guest speaker will be Keith Ivey. Since 1999, Keith has served as the

Missions Consultant for the Georgia Baptist Mission Board. Prior to coming to the GBMB he served as the Associational Missionary in Northeast Georgia, Director of the Georgia Mountain Resort Ministries, and pastored several churches in Georgia and Louisiana.



Keith will be introducing the Missional Outreach Leader Training (MOLT). Only 5% of Georgia Baptist churches have a staff member that leads missions. That means the vast majority are led by the senior pastor or a volunteer. Yet only 14% of Georgia Baptist churches have a volunteer that carries the task of carrying the missions banner. In most cases, that means someone is planning missions trips. Developing missional outreach leaders through a pipeline is essential to every church's effective focus and pursuit of sharing the gospel with the world. We come alongside passionate pastors and churches who desire to develop leaders for the purpose of accomplishing the Great Commission. He will introduce the process of helping our churches improve our missional outreach. You'll be encouraged to enlist a person or team. We've got follow up sessions planned to train these new mission outreach leaders. Keith will meet with these new leaders via ZOOM on Thursdays for six weeks. Here's the schedule...

DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING



It's time to start a new DLife Group. This group is for anyone interested in making disciples and/or helping their church to have a stronger disciple making process. You may be interested in being in the group or maybe there is someone from your church that should be in the group. This is a great way to strengthen the disciple making efforts in your church!

The DLife discipleship group will have no more than fifteen members. In this group we encourage one another, discuss the Bible, and pray together. The DLife Group is both fun and fruitful. The goal of this group is for the participants to multiply and begin a group in their church.

In this 13-week process, we will use the **D-Life Legacy and Leadership Track**, through which we will disciple one another and be introduced to a simple, biblical, and reproducible disciple-making process. WE worked with younger children on our first night, helping them to wrap gifts for their parents, telling them about the birth of Jesus and singing Christmas carols. One of our students was able to share the Gospel with one of the children's brothers and he accepted Christ! Other highlights of the week were: leading two worship opportunities with families receiving food and presents, singing the "16" Days of Christmas, which included 16 Cheese Cones, sharing the Christmas story in drama form to 60 youth, and seeing some snow. Before his tenure at Gateway Seminary, Iorg held various roles that shaped his career as well as the communities he served. As the executive director of the Northwest Baptist Convention, Iorg coordinated the cooperative work of more than 400 churches and increased annual Cooperative Program giving by 30%. His service in the Pacific Northwest began when he planted Pathway Church in Gresham, Oregon. 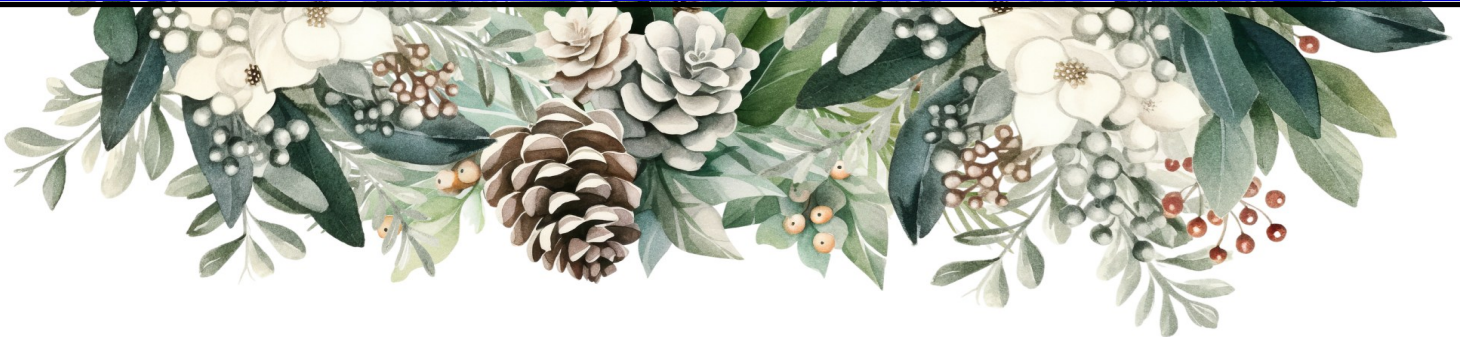

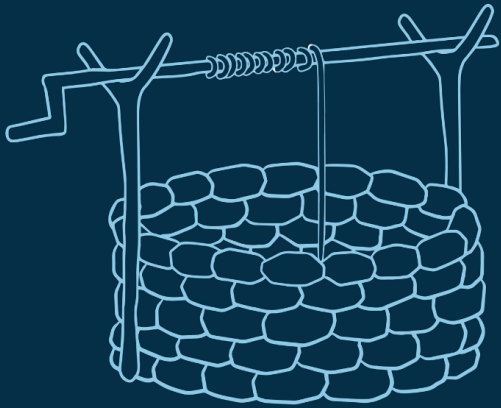
