Messenger Information for the FCBA Annual Meeting

The 133rd Session of the Floyd County Baptist Association will be Monday, September 22nd 6:30-8:30pm. Pastor Brady Fortenberry and the good folks of Fellowship Church have graciously offered to be our host this year. The doors will open at 6:00 pm for messengers to begin checking in.

What's a messenger? A "messenger" refers to a representative from a cooperating FCBA church who attends the annual meeting. These messengers, elected by their local churches, participate in the association's business, including voting on issues and electing officers. Essentially, messengers serve as the voice of their church at the associational/local level.

The plan for registering messengers will be very easy. Simply send an email to fcbaoffice@gmail.com, call 706-291-0904, or drop-off at 308 Redmond Road the names of your elected messengers by noon on Monday, September 8th. Please submit your messenger's names during the FCBA's regular office hours of Monday-Thursday, 8am-4pm. Again, your elected messengers must be in by noon on Monday, September 8th.

The number of messengers for your church is determined through the guidance of the FCBA Constitution and By-laws.

ARTICLE VI. BUSINESS SESSIONS AND MESSENGERS Section 1. Messengers

The Annual Fall Business Session, Spring Business Session and any Special Called Business Session shall be composed of messengers elected by the churches of the Association. Each church which contributes financially (in the current financial year of the Association) to the General Budget of the Association shall be entitled to seven (7) messengers, and to one (1) additional messenger for each \$500 contributed to the General Budget of the Association. No church shall have more than fifteen (15) voting messengers but there is no limit to the number of individuals that may attend the business session.

The giving period was based on January 1, 2025 - June 31, 2025.

Our check in process at the annual meeting will be simple. The messenger names you provide will be on a list at the check in desk/stations. When you and your messengers arrive all you will need to do is tell the volunteers your church name and the name of the messenger. Their name will be checked off, given a Book of Reports and a name tag. If you DO NOT send in the names of your messengers, you will slow down the process! If you do not pre-register your messengers then we will have to write in the names of your messengers. It is imperative that you get us the names of your messengers prior to noon on Monday, September 8th.


