The Beginning

Read these helpful tips before you begin:

- Make sure your personal relationship with God is right. Spend some personal time in prayer before you begin. Confess sin and ask God to prepare your heart to intercede for others.
 - Feel free to pray both aloud and silently. Spend some time walking and praying by yourself, but also have designated meeting locations or times when you gather with others to pray corporately.
 - Use prayer guides, hymns or praise songs, and Scripture as you walk your location.
 - Be sensitive to the Holy Spirit's leading. He may prompt you to spend more time in a particular location, claim a promise of scripture, or speak to someone who has crossed your path.

Read The Word

"The Lord is near all who call out to Him, all who call out to Him with integrity" (Psalm 145:18).

"Will not God grant justice to His elect who cry out to Him day and night? Will He delay to help them? I tell you that He will swiftly grant them justice" (Luke 18:7-8a).

"In the same way the Spirit also joins to help in our weakness, because we do not know what to pray for as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with unspoken groanings. And He who searches the hearts knows the Spirit's mind-set, because He intercedes for the saints according to the will of God" (Romans 8:26-27).

"Now this is the confidence we have before Him: Whenever we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears whatever we ask, we know that we have what we have asked Him for" (1 John 5:14-15).

"Again, I assure you: If two of you on earth agree about any matter that you pray for, it will be done for you by My Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there among them" (Matthew 18:19-20).

"The Lord is far from the wicked, but He hears the prayer of the righteous" (Proverbs 15:29).

Your Personal Prayer Walk

Pray for the Administrators - Pray that the administrators would be given wisdom and guidance to make the best decisions possible.

Pray for the Teachers - Pray that teachers would be able to teach in a way that produces understanding. Pray for God to give them peace and strength as they deal with the increased needs and demands of the classroom.

Pray for the Support Staff - Pray that the support staff would be treated with gratitude and are able to see the difference they make in students' lives. Pray that they would have the resources necessary to complete their job efficiently and effectively.

Pray for the Students - Pray that God would grant students knowledge and understanding. Pray that they would have perseverance to finish strong and that their great needs, both tangible and intangible, would be met.

Pray for Christ to be Represented - Pray that there would be a strong representation of Christ's love on this campus. Pray for Christian students, faculty, staff, and outside ministries to be beacons of light who would draw others to Him.

Pray for Safety - Pray for a hedge of protection to surround this campus. Whether it is bullying or illnesses, pray that threats to the health and safety of the campus would be eliminated.

The Prayer Walk with a Group

Someone will need to lead the group. Begin walking around your assigned campus. The leader will call the group to stop, call on someone or ask for a volunteer to pray and then another to read the scripture.

Step ONE: Pray for the many students who have never accepted Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Pray for Christians to have a holy boldness as they live and share the gospel with their peers.

Step TWO: Pray that the believers would walk in the Spirit. Pray that they will have a passion for God's Word and that they will apply Biblical truth to all areas of their life.

Step THREE: Pray that students will find their significance from who they are in Christ. Pray that they will be more concerned with what Christ thinks of them than what others think of them.

Step FOUR: Pray that students will admit their own sin, ask others for forgiveness, and repent. Pray that students will have an attitude of brokenness and humility instead of pride. Pray they would be obedient to parents and teachers.

Step FIVE: Pray that Christian teachers will have the eyes of Christ so that they might minister to their students. Pray that God will give the administration and school board wisdom to make decisions according to His will.

Step SIX: Pray that students will learn to take every thought captive to the obedience of Christ. Pray against the influence and deception of drugs, alcohol, ungodly music and media. Pray that students would not allow social media to influence them in a negative way that could distract them from a deeper relationship with Christ. Pray that students would use discernment when choosing their friends.

Step SEVEN: Pray that our churches will equip students to be campus missionaries and that we would minister to students, families, teachers, and administration. Pray that we would make disciples of all nations.
