Changing, Preparing, Glorifying

“For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.” Ephesians 2:10

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

Have you had enough winter weather advisories lately? I’m sure you have; I know I have. But look on the bright side—literally—each day we are gaining more daylight as we approach springtime. And as we enter the church on Sunday mornings during the month of February you will see some noticeable changes as well. We will make the change from the season of Epiphany to the season of Lent which begins on Wednesday February 18th (Ash Wednesday). But before we move into preparation mode (40 days) to celebrate the Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord, we will spend a few Sundays exploring our role as stewards of God and His creation.

“Stewards Engaged in God’s Work” is the title of our three-week series this month. The Bible has much to say about how we who are called and chosen by God to participate in the Body of Christ through sharing, serving, and giving. This series, in and of itself, is good preparation for the lengthy Lenten season. You should have received an email inviting you to watch a short video introducing this series. Please be sure to check your inbox.

Then on Ash Wednesday we will change our focus once more to one of preparation. The prophet Joel proclaims, “Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love(2:10). Lent is a time for reflection, repentance, and focusing on the story of Jesus’ sacrificial death and His glorious resurrection. What better way to prepare than to use one of our beautiful hymns as our theme for our midweek worship services. “O Love, How Deep” LSB 544, is a rich and moving hymn that tells a story, teaches, and paints pictures in our minds of the great works of God. The title “For Us” speaks to who God is and what He brings in giving us His Son. It helps us understand why God would send His Son to die for us. And don’t forget that before we worship on Wednesday’s we will gather for our Lenten Dinners at 6:00pm. You can expect good food and good fellowship followed by God’s good Word that always nourishes and satisfies our souls.

I look forward to seeing you throughout the month of February, a time for changing seasons that move us to always Glorify God and Impact the Community.

Whose Money Is It Anyway?

Our perspective of ownership will affect our attitudes toward money. If we view money as our own rather than belonging to God, we will use it differently than if we acknowledge that it belongs to Him. God's Word clearly states that He is the sole owner of all things. *"The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein"* (Psalm 24:1). We must honestly remember that we are stewards, entrusted by God, in charge of the goods He has given to us.

We are warned in Deuteronomy 8:17-18: *"Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.' You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is He Who gives you the power to get wealth..."* God is not only the owner of everything, He is the source of our wealth. He even gives you the desire and ability to work and earn a living.

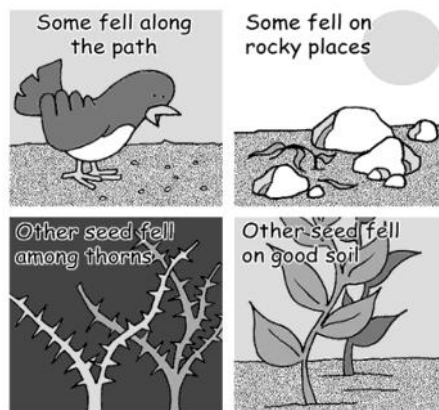
How we answer the question regarding the ownership of our money is pivotal. Will we acknowledge God's ownership and control? Do

we see ourselves as a steward, not an owner? Even though we may verbalize the right answers to these questions, our lives may not give evidence of what we say. Because money and material things can become sources of pride and self-sufficiency, we can easily live with the attitude that we are in control, so we follow the ways of the world and our own desires.

In the Parable of the Sower, Jesus warns us about how our attitude toward money and things can affect our response to God's Word. Jesus stated that some *"seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them"* (Matthew 13:7). He explained, *"As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful"* (Matthew 13:22). Having money and possessions can deceive you into believing that nothing is more important than owning things and enjoying the things money can buy. If the love of money controls your heart, God is pushed aside, and you will endanger your eternity with Him.

Stewardship Corner - Jesus spoke to the issue of greed in Matthew 16:26 when He asked, *"For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul?"* The things we possess will contribute only to fleeting happiness, not an enduring peace and contentment. Our focus on things can blind us to the emptiness of our faith. The one who is blessed materially is not necessarily discontent, but those who depend on their wealth to bring them contentment will be disappointed. Thus, the deciding factor is the relationship between a person and his wealth. Consider Abraham, one of the richest people in the Bible. Abraham had amassed wealth, but he knew that all he had belonged to God. In God, he had everything. His

"For us" is not simply a pithy line to use because it is easy to repeat. It is a confession of who God is and what He brings in giving us His Son. It helps us understand why God would send His Son to die for us.

The phrase "for us" also captures much of the Reformation's theological emphasis—and Luther's understanding of Scripture in particular. Luther went from searching for a righteous God and finding only stern rebuke to seeing God in the form of a little baby and as the one who became one of us for us so that we might become like Him.

Our Lenten preaching series hymn "O Love, How Deep" (LSB 544) was originally a twenty-three-stanza poem written in the fifteenth century by an unknown author. In the nineteenth century, an Anglican cleric named Benjamin Webb translated the hymn into English and then chose six stanzas for use in English hymnody. The doxological stanza was added later.
