We are created and molded as stewards by the Holy Spirit in a life-long process that includes conversion to the shape of the life we see in Jesus Christ and many experiences of losing and finding our way in the Lord.” Despite our unworthiness, God has chosen us in Christ to become His stewards. By our own reason or strength, we are unable to be faithful in our stewardship, but, through the Holy Spirit working within us through Word and Sacrament, we can be faithful stewards. Our stewardship becomes a joy rather than an obligation. It is our connection to Christ which enables us to be stewards each and every day. As the Apostle Paul wrote, “I can do all things through Him Who gives me strength” (Philippians 4:13). God equips us to do whatever He calls us to do.

Because of God’s goodness, He thinks so highly of us that He trusts us to administer what belongs to Him. As God’s stewards, we understand the privileges and responsibilities that we have in all the relationships of life. Our stewardship impacts our relationships with our families, neighbors, co-workers, and with all of creation. As His stewards, we receive His gifts thankfully, manage them responsibly, and give them generously.

Christian stewardship puts our faith into action. It is our whole-hearted response to God’s redeeming love. Faith gives us access to God’s endless source of power, and faith produces the works of love that we do in Christ. May God help each of us become the stewards who tap into His strength, seek to do His will, and attempt to fulfill His purposes.

## Spirit-filled Stewards

In the Old Testament, a steward had a close relationship with his master and was given much responsibility. A steward acted as the owner's representative. For example, Abraham's chief steward was sent to a foreign country to bring back a wife for Abraham's son, Isaac (Genesis 24). Likewise, Joseph was a trusted steward of the Egyptian Pharaoh, and he managed Egypt's economy (Genesis 41).

New Testament stewards were given even greater responsibilities and privileges. The Apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 3:9, *“For we are God’s fellow workers...”* To accomplish His purposes, God has chosen to work with and through us. We have become joined in partnership with Christ as His fellow workers. God has formed this partnership with those He has chosen, so that the Gospel can be shared with everyone. We are His ambassadors to the world. It is the Lord Who enables and equips our partnership. We are called to use our voices, feet, and hands as well as our lives in this partnership to serve and honor Him.

Through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, our stewardship becomes even more than a partnership. We become adopted sons and daughters in God's family. As part of God's family, we are given even greater responsibilities, and, as obedient children, we willingly obey and follow our heavenly Father's direction.
