All Thanks Be to God with Us!

"Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 136:1). Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

People are quick to celebrate during moments of great success. That's normal and we expect that. But for those in the spotlight it's magnified many times over. Some examples are those receiving an award such as a Nobel Prize, professional sports teams winning a championship, a politician who wins an election, etc. It's during these celebrations that they are often surrounded by others who share their experience. In these joyful moments they are quick to give thanks to those who have helped make those achievements possible. The names of those who had a positive impact on them, who truly made a difference in their lives, are shared publicly. They are in the spotlight. We are drawn into their experience and are made aware of those who had such an impact on their lives, it's a very special moment. That's what it's like in the earthly realm.

In the month of November, we gather with family to share a delicious meal and "give thanks" for the many blessings in our lives. At Immanuel we gather with other believers the night before Thanksgiving Day to "give thanks" to God who graciously gives us all things, "The eyes of all look to you, and you give them their food in due season. You open your hand; you satisfy the desire of every living thing (Ps 145:15-16). Giving thanks to God is expressed through prayer and praise in the Divine Service. "I will give you thanks in the great assembly; among the throngs of people I will praise you" (Ps 35:18). The difference between our giving thanks to God and those who publicly thank others is obvious. We are set apart for the things of God (made holy and called saints). But God's people are not in the spotlight, nor do we seek it. Instead, we thank God silently throughout the day or audibly for others to hear, "I will praise you, O Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonders" (Ps 9:1).

Giving thanks to God is beyond the scope of earthly thanks and praise. We thank God in all circumstances—the good, the bad, and everything in between—that's not always easy, but it is God's will for us (1Thess. 5:18). Ultimately, when we give thanks to God, He receives all the glory. The spotlight is on Him as we gather around Word and Sacrament celebrating His greatest achievement—sending His Son Jesus Christ who bore our sin and became our Savior by rising again from the dead for our justification. This is the greatest reason to give thanks to God. I look forward to worshiping with you each time we come together at Immanuel to pray, praise, and give thanks to Immanuel, God with us. Amen.


