Giving Cheerfully

In the Old Testament, the people knew what God expected them to give because He commanded the people to tithe, which required the people to give one-tenth of their harvest or produce (income) to the Lord. As New Covenant Christians, we have the freedom to decide what to give, but we are expected to give cheerfully. "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7). Giving is not to be based strictly by the percentage we give to the Lord but by the largeness of our hearts toward God. God appreciates bighearted people who give their money to Him cheerfully. It's not always easy to give cheerfully, because we need to spend money on rent or mortgages, food, and clothing, and we would like to take some nice family vacations or drive newer calls, etc. It is tempting to scrimp on generosity or to give with a frown.

Our human spirit has been profoundly twisted by Adam's sin, and this present world is a hard place to live. There is only one way that we can rise above those circumstances to live a new life where generous and cheerful giving is the norm and not the exception. In order for us to do this, we must have a personal faith relationship with Jesus Christ and day after day tap into God's rich supply of life-changing grace. The only power that can consistently overcome the sin nature that still clings to each of us is the cross of Jesus Christ.

The Apostle Paul declared this Gospel truth in Galatians 2:20. He emphasized, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me." If we believe in Jesus as our Savior and Lord, then our sinful flesh has been nailed to the cross with Christ, and the self- absorbed and fearful human ego no longer has any right or power to direct how we as Christians live. We can take this truth and apply it to the way we give. Through faith, we are empowered to withstand our flesh and the world who wants us to spend more of our money on things of this world and to give less to God. When we place our trust in God, we can honor Him by giving cheerfully.

As new covenant Christians, we give under grace so we are free to decide in our hearts and minds how much to give. Cheerful givers experience giving as a privilege. Giving changes from a "got to" give to a "want to" give. Cheerful giving comes from new hearts that God through His Holy Spirit has changed. Giving is to be inspired and voluntary, not an obligation or only out of necessity or possible recognition. Giving is an outward expression based on an inner conviction. Through faith, we understand that we are God's instruments through whom He works to help people in need, to support His Church, and to extend His kingdom. May God find us willing and cheerful to use our time and money to do His work.

We live in a land of plenty, which promotes its own twist on contentment. Its version is "buy and possess." Our culture is geared far more to the material than the spiritual. Our society tells us that we need and deserve more, and that life is not complete unless we have the finest homes and cars plus wealth and success. We are led to believe that happiness and contentment are within our reach if we just acquire a few more things. Advertisements are geared to make us feel discontent so that we will buy more things to make us happy.

Greed will not allow contentment, because it always urges us to acquire more. No matter how hard we try, we cannot be satisfied by worldly things. There is truth in the old adage, "The more one gets the more one wants." The love of money can potentially possess a person's life like no other emotion can. A person can spend a lifetime chasing prosperity that, when found, often destroys him as discussed in the following story:

A ship full of men sailed to an island to look for gold. When they arrived, they di-

vided into two groups. One group would dig for gold; the other would plant crops and prepare the food. As time went on, they found gold. More of the men who prepared the food began to dig for gold. As more men came to the island, most of them also dug for gold. Even the ship was torn apart so the wood could be used to support the mineshafts. The story ends when some time later, people visited the island and found skeletons draped over vast treasures. Greed had taken over; and they had completely missed their meaning and purpose in life.

Money has been called the "the god of those who have too much, and the goal of those who have too little." Blessed indeed is the person who avoids these extremes. Our goal as God's people is to seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness. He has promised to take care of our needs.
