



## STEP 01

### Initial Consultation

- The process begins with an initial consultation between the family or representative of the deceased and one of our specialists, Call 212-596-6161.
- During this consultation, we gather information about the deceased and the desired repatriation arrangements.



## STEP 02

### Documentation Collection

- We will assist the family in gathering the necessary documentation, which typically includes the death certificate, embalming certificate (if required), and any permits or authorizations needed for transportation.



## STEP 03

### Legal and Regulatory Compliance

- We will ensure compliance with all legal and regulatory requirements for repatriation shipping, including international regulations, customs laws, and transportation guidelines.

## Embalming and Preparation

- If required by regulations or for preservation purposes during transportation, the remains are embalmed and prepared for shipping by licensed professionals.
- The family selects a suitable casket for transportation, taking into account the size, material, and personal preferences.

- We will arrange transportation for the remains, which may include air transportation, ground transportation, or a combination of both, depending on the distance and destination.
