Saluting Our Veterans On Veteran's Day, November 11th

The following is a list of some of our residents and family members of residents who have served in the

military. It is with deepest appreciation that we honor them and thank them for their service to our Nation!

- Resident Tim Guerette served as a Sergeant in the United States Air Force from 1986 to 1990. He was stationed at Hahn Air Base in Germany from 1986 to 1988. Additionally, He was stationed at Homestead Air Force Base in Florida from 1988 to 1990. Tim was a munitions specialist responsible for building, storing and transporting nuclear and conventional weapons.
- Departed husband of resident Donna Lang, Jim Lang served in Vietnam in the Army's 101st Airborne Screaming Eagles from 1964 to 1968. Jim fought in some of the fiercest battles of the early days of the Vietnam conflict. He served with valor and honor resulting in Jim being awarded a Bronze Star and Purple Heart among many other medals.
- Son of residents Dessie and Rich Leff, Jason Bradt, MD served as a Flight Surgeon in the 393rd Bomb Squadron at Whiteman Air Force Base. He served from 1997 to 2003. He was a graduate of Top Knife (Air Force Flight Surgeon Top Gun School). In addition, he was an aircraft mishap investigator and a B-2 continuation survival school instructor. He was part of Operation Noble Anvil (First use of the B-2 Airplane in war) to bomb Serbian forces in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. Jason also served in Operation Infinite Justice/Enduring Freedom air war over Afghanistan in response to the attacks on 9-11 on the U.S. mainland.

- Resident Leala Martinez recognizes the service of her husband Calixtro Martinez He served in the United States Marine Corps for 20 years with 5 of those in active duty combat overseas. Calixtro is currently using the GI bill to attend college with the goal of attending Medical School. Leala and their 5 children are beyond proud of Calixtro.
- Resident Ben Pelton served in the Army from 1993 to 1997. He went in with a Ranger contract, but was recruited to Ft. Myer in VA to work with the Old Guard. The Old Guard is the ceremonial unit to the President of The United States. They also serve in burial ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery (which is their primary function). Ben was part of the Caisson Platoon which performs the horse drawn burial ceremonies in Arlington National Cemetery. He was promoted to Sergeant and was the Training NCO in charge of training new Caisson riders during the latter part of his service.
- Resident John Rabold served in the United States Air Force for more than ten years. John served as an Acquisitions Officer/ Program Manager for weapons systems including aircraft and green door projects (high level classified projects). John transitioned to a Medical Services Corps Officer in charge of managing medical professionals. He had a deployment to Afghanistan and was awarded a Bronze Star. During his service John was stationed at Elgin Air Force Base, Wright Patterson Air Force Base, and Lackland Airforce Base.
- Resident Raymond Schrader served in the United States Marine Corps as a Sergeant E-5 Active Duty from 1963 to 1966.

Rose's journey in becoming an artisan began with a visit to Hobby Lobby. She came across a whimsical plaque that read "Bake Me a Cake As Fast As You Can!". The saying brought back memories of playing patty cake with her daughters and grandchildren. It also lit an interest for creating an artificial cake that would complement the plaque. Purchasing it led Rose to begin researching and experimenting on how to create what she envisioned. Subsequently, Rose crafted a cake to go with the plaque. This perfect display still sits on her kitchen counter.

What started as a kitchen display quickly turned into a full-fledged passion. Completely self-taught, she now creates everything from cupcakes, cookies, and rock candy to hot cocoa mugs, cotton candy, and even full-size

cakes. Using professional foam bases for the shapes and creating finishing touches with materials like spackle, puff paint, clay and any idea she has that fits the bill. Rose's faux treats are all unique, synthetic and inedible. Her displays are perfect for gifting, holiday ornaments, indoor décor, home staging, store displays and even photo shoots.

Homemade Marshmallow Recipe

There's something magical about homemade marshmallows. Forget the rubbery bagged ones from the grocery store. Although they are convenient, these homemade light, pillowy sweet convections will just melt in your mouth! They're great for gifting, holiday decorating, adding to hot chocolate and elevating the flavor of s'mores. Plus, they're easy and kids love to help make them!

Ingredients:

- 3 packages unflavored gelatin
- 1 ½ cups granulated sugar
- cup light corn syrup
- 3/4 tsp kosher salt
- 1 Tbsp pure vanilla extract
- Confectioners' sugar, for dusting

Combine the gelatin and ½ cup of cold water in a large bowl. Affix the whisk attachment to an electric mixer and then let it sit while you make the syrup.









In a small pan, combine sugar, corn syrup, salt and ½ cup water. Cook over medium heat until the sugar melts. Raise the heat to high and cook until the syrup reaches 240 degrees on a candy thermometer. Remove from the heat.

With the mixer on low speed, slowly pour the sugar syrup into the dissolved gelatin. Put the mixer on high speed and whip until the mixture is very thick (about 15 minutes). Add the vanilla and mix thoroughly.

Using a fine strainer, generously dust and 8 x 12 inch nonmetal baking dish (like Pyrex) with confectioners' sugar. Pour the marshmallow mixture into the dish, smooth the top and dust with more confectioners' sugar. Allow to stand uncovered overnight until it dries out.

Turn the marshmallows onto a board and cut them into desired shapes, Dust with confectioners' sugar & ENJOY!
