
































Accelerate the Possibilities

Grounded in data, the WNY Women's Foundation drives solutions to advance gender equity and move Western New York forward. We believe that collaboratively tackling issues that women struggle with is the best way to catalyze change in our community. We base our work on four pillars, which include advocacy, voice, leadership, and economic empowerment creating opportunities for each woman to learn, earn, lead, and thrive.



Leadership Letter

In 2022, the WNY Women's Foundation (WNYWF) marked a year of acceleration in moving our mission forward as our growing staff and community partners built new initiatives to benefit women. We achieved significant wins in state policy and reignited the excitement for our signature in-person events. These accomplishments came as our organization re-adapted after two years of the Covid-19 pandemic and as local tragedies highlighted the inequities in our community.

Like many organizations, in 2020 and 2021 we reacted in real time to the uncertainty by centering our efforts on women-owned businesses and loudly raising our voices to address the inadequacies of the child care system.

We entered 2022 knowing there was more work than ever to be done and were devastated when our community was the target of a racist hate shooting on May 14, 2022, with 10 beautiful lives taken. Unfortunately, later in the year, Buffalo once again endured another horrific tragedy when a blizzard took the lives of dozens of residents. These events signify that we must work harder than ever to close the inequitable gaps in our community by linking arms with our partners and community leaders, taking action together to do better for the next generations, especially women. Together we can accelerate the possibilities, driving equity for all.

Key actions your investment supported:

- Advocacy wins at the state level to support child care providers and families
- Raising our Voice to inform high-level reports and resources that support women in the workforce
- Economic Empowerment for our mPower learners, particularly our first cohorts of the Health Care Hub in collaboration with Lineage Group and Harvest House
- Promoting women in Leadership and providing local companies the tools and resources to implement strong policies around diversity, equity, and inclusion

We also reimagined two of our signature events, with a well-received new twist on Fall in Fashion and an inspiring panel of talented women who highlighted What She's Made Of.

Our work is far from over. We will continue the fight for universal child care in New York State, and inform the public on critical issues through media interviews. We will empower women, particularly in East Buffalo, to achieve the economic stability their families deserve, and apply data-driven solutions to advance women's leadership in the workforce.

We do all of this with your generous support. Thank you for helping us advance our mission to create opportunities for all women to learn, earn, lead, and thrive.

We educate and engage decision makers to advance policies and funding, accelerating the pace of change for issues impacting women, such as child care, pay equity, economic mobility, and professional advancement.

Advocacy 2022 - By the Numbers

- Drove an additional \$2 million to Erie County to expand child care subsidies for working families, impacting over 343 children
- Provided leadership to a coalition that secured a transformational state investment (\$7 billion) in the child care workforce and businesses, and increased families' eligibility for financial assistance
- Offered guidance for the Cornell ILR Cost of Child Care Report, which quantified the payment gap for child care centers that accept subsidies. This data secured an increased payment rate for these businesses (most of which are women-owned and serve our most economically disenfranchised families)

"With rising food prices and just the cost of everything in general, I was stuck in a position where I wasn't sure how I was going to pay for daycare. Child Care Desert Mapping Tool

WNYWF used its thought leadership and grassroots understanding of the issues impacting child care providers to partner with the John R. Oishei Foundation to commission Cornell University ILR Buffalo Co-Lab's development of a mapping tool to connect and spark innovation for child care providers and businesses.



This useful resource shows the locations of child care deserts, large businesses and child care providers, allowing businesses to better access child care for their employees and for child care centers to identify opportunities for growth. It can be accessed at: childcarewny.org.

In 2022, we launched our expanded mPower: From Education to Employment initiative. mPower brings our MOMs: From Education to Employment® and Women's Economic Mobility workforce training programs under one unified brand.

Why mPower?

- 8% of single mothers enrolled in college graduate within six years, compared to 49% of nonparent students
- Only program in the region that specifically targets single moms' unique needs to ensure success in education
- Comprehensive mPower model includes distinctive features:
 - Policy advancements to remove barriers
 - Case management/navigation
 - · Job readiness and transition skills
 - Support for logistical and skill-based barriers
 - Child care and emergency scholarships

Women's Economic Mobility Pathway/Health Care Hub



- Provides a pathway to employment to help women re-enter or move up in the workforce
- Fills an urgent need for health care workers through a six-week, paid training program
- Students receive hands-on training that directly leads to full-time employment as a certified nursing assistant (CNA) at a Lineage Group facility
- mPower model addresses the multi-faceted challenges women face, particularly in East Buffalo
- Provides a support system to address food insecurity, housing, academic readiness, and adverse lived experiences

- 22 graduates in cohorts 1-3
- 64% graduation rate, with additional supports provided for those seeking to retest and those not quite ready for employment

Our Work in Action: Meet Talicia

Talicia credits mPower and Harvest House for helping her through a challenging time in her life while she studied in the CNA program. A single mother of four, Talicia now works full-time at The Greenfields Continuing Care Community. She described her gratitude for the education and also the extra support she received, such as Christmas gifts for her children and food assistance.

"It touched my heart to the point where I had a few moments in that class where I burst out in tears, so happy I found this program. It's like a family ... there was no way I wasn't going to make it through the program, because they were so encouraging and helped me every step of the way." - Talicia


