PASTOR'S NOTE:

Our Pastoral Council members have been talking with some of our parishioners of limited mobility, who attend Sunday Mass, regarding their needs for seating near the new south entrance of the church building. They and John Toennies, our maintenance manager, have developed the sketch, above, of proposed changes in the seating near the south entrance. This will accommodate two to three wheelchairs and provide chairs with armrests. Kneelers will be installed on the chairs for use by the person behind each chair.

The blue tape on the pews and floor in this area also shows the proposed modifications. There are also blue tape markings near the north entrance to show proposed changes there.

With the removal of the three 10-foot pews, we would lose seating for 18 people but regain seating for 6 people in the new chairs, plus the number of wheelchairs that are used.

Pastoral Council members will be noting how many people with wheelchairs and walkers are in church for the next few weekends and how they currently are using the pews and space available.

Please provide your questions and comments to our Pastoral Council members or myself by 12 November so we can decide how to act on these proposals. If you have written comments, please send them to our parish email address above or mail them to, or drop them by, the parish office. Any seating changes will also have to be approved by the diocese before proceeding. Thank you very much for your consideration of these proposals.


