From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

On a Sunday in late February 2010, the Presbytery of the Pines, encompassing congregations from Northern Louisiana and Southern Arkansas, ordained me. It was a joyful service, quite similar to the installation service we held last November. At the end of it, I was declared a “Minister of Word and Sacrament”.

Within two years, the denomination returned to an older title for those who preach and administer the sacraments: “Teaching Elder”. This change brought historic connotations that contrasted my role with those who serve on Session. Ruling Elders govern and make decisions for the good of the congregation. Teaching Elders, according to our Book of Order, “are committed in all their work to teaching the faith in word and in deed and equipping the people of God for their ministry and witness.”

I believe the best teachers are continual learners. In fact, I believe that all people benefit from keeping hearts and minds receptive to a continual education from the Holy Spirit. Paul precedes me in this belief, as he offers that faithful Christians are not (yet) finished Christians: “The One who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ” (Philippians 1:6).

Therefore, I want to extend two invitations to you for education this spring.

Sunday, April 12 will be a celebration of the history of this congregation, beginning with the organizing of our two predecessor congregations, through the chartering of this congregation on April 8, 1955, and to the present day. In worship we will remember how the Spirit has led us in the past and is leading us into the future. After worship, I invite you to teach me and others about this congregation’s history by contributing photos, stories, testimonies, and prayers to a timeline that will be hanging in the Gathering Room.

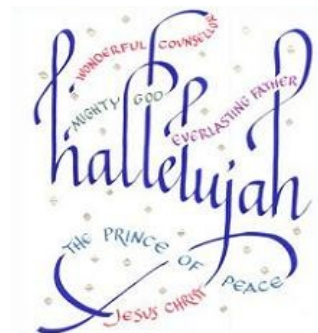

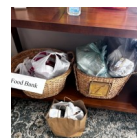
## Donations Needed

Donations of the following items are always needed. Please just drop off as to the location noted below. Thank you.

- Kitchen supplies: Saran wrap, Ziplock bags, foil, dishwashing liquid, hand soap, and plastic gloves for working in the kitchen and serving food. (Place in the kitchen.)
- White trash bags for Wawa collection (Place in the area by the choir robes with the insulated bags.)
- Baskets: (Place outside the office.)
- Shopping Bags: (Place in the container next to the Mission Table.)
- Non-Perishable foods: (Please fill our baskets under the Mission Table. Anything nonperishable is welcome.)
- Note paper tablets and pens in a container to put on the tables in the conference room. This would be most helpful for meetings.



**Food Donations:** Friends, Each Monday Rev. Dr. Nancy Holt Timothy delivers donations of food to Food Banks serving Delaware County. Please consider donating Non-Perishable items to help our neighbors in need. You can place them in the basket label "Food Bank" at the top of the ramp.



**Print Cartridges:** These are recycled to Staples for credit to be used by the office. (container on the Mission Table)

**Flip Tops:** Flip Tops used on soda cans, etc. are donated to the Ronald McDonald House. They are then recycled, and the money is used towards utility bills. (Container on the Mission Table)

NSPC successfully completed the 9th year for Rise Against Hunger. The committee is planning for year 10 but needs some workers and ideas:

### IDEAS:

- 1) The Flea Market was a great idea and those running it did a magnificent job. Unfortunately, it is a lot of work for a few people. Wondering if we could either come up with a committee of several people to handle this and make it lighter work or come up with another idea that would raise money towards the RAH Event.
- 2) The auction is another great idea but a lot of work. In order to hold it for year 10 much more help is needed. Some of the volunteers are willing, but all donations need to be collected from businesses and turned in by mid-October. Help is needed in the area of publicity, typing the forms (copies of previous years are available), set up of the auction, sales at the end of auction, calling all winners not present, disperse and collect money from absent winners, distribute the Thank You Certificate and letter to all those who donated. A volunteer is willing to make all the easels used for donations if the donation arrives by mid-October.



Thank you all very much for the support you have given along the way to the Mission Project with Rise Against Hunger (RAH). We raised enough money to package 20,000 meals at our 9th packaging event on March 8th. Over 100 people joined in on the event. It was a multi-generational event, and it ran like a top. Music played, the gong rang for every 1000 meals packaged and supplies were refilled at all the funnel stations at a quick pace.

In between packaging, snacks were available from donations by: Jacquette's Bakery, Wegman's, Costco & Acme.

The RAH Committee was busy all year and we appreciate their support with the many fundraisers, planning, and of course the culminating event on March 8th. So many hands made this work.

We are looking forward to more helpers if we continue to plan the 10th year for RAH and NSPC. **If successful in 2027, we will have packaged 200,000 meals!**

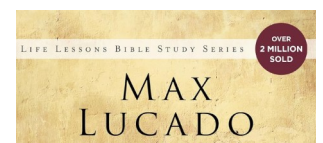
