From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

A pastor with whom I worked years ago liked to remind her colleagues, "The only people who like change are babies with wet diapers." While the imagery makes me a bit uncomfortable, I find her point valid. Change can be difficult. Change can make us anxious. Change can upset us and fill us with dread.

In the middle of this month, this community of faith will undergo a significant change. Our wonderful Director of Music, Ting Ting Wong, will move on to a new congregation. Our congregation will have the opportunity to celebrate her ministry with and among us on February 15. The next day, we will have changed. While we know the situation from which we are changing, we do not fully know the situation that will come next. As we search for a new Director of Music, I invite everyone to pray for God's will to be done.

The Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) tell a story of one of the hardest moments of change in the Gospel story. Jesus called his disciples together and after a discussion of his identity as the Messiah, he began to tell them that they would be leaving Galilee and journeying through Judea toward Jerusalem, and that in Jerusalem, he would suffer, be rejected, and be put to death. Peter, upon hearing about this significant change to the disciples' ministry, "began to rebuke" Jesus. Peter's anxiety could not be contained. Fear overtook him. He insisted that Jesus was wrong.

We know the stories that follow, though. The disciples undertook the significant change in ministry, departing the territory of Galilee, briefly visiting Samaria, and then preaching in Judea. They entered Jerusalem to shouts of acclaim. Then Jesus was arrested. All that he said came to pass.

FINANCIAL UPDATE



Financial Update: NSPC Congregation February 2026

"We approach God most nearly when are in one sense least like God. His limitless power and our cry for help." Four Loves by CS Lewis.

As we begin a new year looking back at 2025, we have made major progress in our financial standing. Our budget is growing, Pastor Bill has been installed, our Legacy increasing, our bank accounts are positive, and our debt declining! Please take time to read all about it in the NSPC Annual Report.

Looking back to the beginning of Growing Our Future, we, as a congregation, made a decision to renovate approximately 5,000 sq. ft. of office space, plus build an additional 5,000 sq. ft. of new construction, cafe, restrooms, community space, parking, lighting, and landscaping. Not only did this save us \$ in six figures, (built during COVID) it brought NSPC up to code environmentally with one level handicap access. During the past decade or more, NSPC stands as possibly the only major capital expansion of a spiritual (non-profit) nature, in Newtown Township. Construction cost totaled approximately \$2,100,000. During construction, we paid approximately \$1,000,000. Leaving us \$1.15 million as a 20-year mortgage @ 5.77% with the Presbyterian Investment & Loan Program. As of December 2025, that mortgage totals \$544,000. During 2025 we escalated our principal payments. Adding interest and other costs, we have paid approximately \$1.66 million!

Which brings us back to as CS Lewis put it "Our Cry for Help". Please continue your prayers and your current level of giving in 2026. If you are new to NSPC please prayerfully consider a gift to the retirement of our mortgage. This will be gratefully accepted. Although at this point, we are not planning a formal Capital Campaign, we are asking for your thoughts and prayers as we move forward to a Burning of the Mortgage ceremony. More on this to come.

It is a busy month here at NSPC Music Ministry! On February 1st, the choir and the quartet will be leading us with some communion focused hymns. We will be presenting *One Bread One Day*. We are also trying something new with a song during prelude. The children will be singing *Jesus Loves Me* during the Children's Message. Rise Against Hunger

Our ongoing Mission Fundraisers for RAH have been a big success. We have had several fundraisers, and we have passed our goal of \$8040 to purchase the supplies to do the packaging event on March 8th. Along with the committee members who have organized and run these fundraisers from beginning to end, you are to be thanked for supporting them. Our numbers are not final yet. The Outback purchases are complete from tickets used through January 31st. The amount that we will receive from our ticket sales will be given to us from the managing owner sometime in February. We pay for the food costs only. Tips were paid by those enjoying a meal.

The extra money will go toward the seed money for next year. This is a bonus for NSPC. If the Silent Auction is not part of the fundraising, the seed money will be very helpful.




Men's Christian Fellowship


