From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,



Please Join Us in Congratulating Declan Robinson!

His community service project for Eagle Scout Rank was dedicated to protect local trees from the invasive Spotted Lantern Fly infestation. Protecting local trees is beneficial to all of us living in Newtown Square; and with the help of fellow Scouts, Declan's project protected

71 trees in the Newtown Square Drexel Park lodge area. Declan is thankful for the support of his family, friends, and community, which enabled him to achieve the honor of becoming an Eagle Scout.


Thanks to all who attended, and we hope to have an evening event in the Fall. Ideas are needed but we are
