## From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

The quick visit to the grocery store grew longer and longer, as Ella and I each remembered items from home that were in short supply. We had gone to the store only for salad greens and fresh fruit. Now we carried in our arms those items, as well as a loaf of bread, a pack of yogurt smoothies, a gallon of milk, and a wish that we had chosen to grab one of the store-provided baskets from the entranceway. That did not stop us, though, from making one last detour. “Do we need to visit the Easter aisle?” I asked. Ella could not refuse. We added dark chocolate truffles to our burdens, happy that no one in our family had chosen to fast from sweets for Lent.

One of the challenges of faithful living in the modern age is that we are surrounded by the temptation to rush to the end. Christmas decorations go on sale before trick-or-treaters are in bed, Valentine hearts replace New Year’s Eve noisemakers shortly after midnight, and Easter jelly beans and chocolates arrive in baskets before Ash Wednesday rolls around on the calendar.

The downside to this hurried rush to the next holiday is that we take little time to make each holiday’s message last. Too anxious to wait, we unwrap and eat the chocolate truffles now, as though unsure that they will be available for us to enjoy later.

There is a faithfulness required for waiting. When God promised a family to Abraham and Sarah, led Moses and the Israelites through desert wildernesses to a land of freedom, urged the exiled people of Judah to return to their country and rebuild, God asked them to wait and to work for a holy community. In each instance, the people grew anxious and tried to find shortcuts to settle their nervous hearts. Even the disciples of Jesus needed to be reminded that the message of peace and reconciliation takes time. They needed to wait and to work.

As do we. Lent is a season to reflect on what is broken and in need of healing in our lives so that when we arrive at Easter, we can proclaim the good news of Jesus’ resurrection, that the One who was wounded for us can heal us, the One who was crucified lives.

## Welcome our new Director of Music...



Pianist and conductor **Jin Hyun Park** is a graduate of the Saint Petersburg State Conservatory. Her performances, both as a soloist and with ensembles, have included appearances at the Kastamoksha Music Festival, as well as concerts with the Saint Petersburg Regional Orchestra and Saint Petersburg String Quartet. She gave solo recitals at Saint Petersburg's Kapella Hall and Philharmonic Hall, and in Pushkin City.

Following her time in Russia, Ms. Park earned her B.M. in piano performance and M.M. in chamber piano accompanying and opera coaching at Temple University, Philadelphia studying with Harvey Wedeen and Lambert Orkis.

She was the recipient of the Millard E. Gladfelter Scholarship, awarded to a student with "high scholarship, demonstrated need, and exceptional professional promise."

She participated as an apprentice pianist with the Lake George Opera Company, SongFest LA, and Philadelphia's Russian Opera Workshop.

Ms. Park worked as staff Pianist at Curtis Summerfest Programs, Opera Libera and Ester Boyer College of Music at Temple University.

She is an active chamber musician in the greater Philadelphia area and works as staff pianist and coach at the Curtis Institute of Music, where she joined the faculty in 2016.

Ms. Park has served as the conductor of the women's choir at First Korean Presbyterian Church of Philadelphia. Most recently, she has served as conductor for the Adult Choir, Bell Choir, and Children's Choir at the Presbyterian Church of Deep Run.

Jin Hyun will bless us with her musical talents beginning on Sunday, March 1st. We hope that you will be here to help welcome her!





## Buildings and Grounds Update

While investigating damage to our sanctuary ceiling, we discovered some major leaks from the steeple and steeple base. There is no point in having our sanctuary ceiling repaired and painted until we resolve the problem with the steeple.

We are in the process of waiting to hear back from a steeple jack who will inspect the steeple for any potential leaks. We had that done several years ago and to be on the safe side, we're having it inspected again. We are most concerned about the base of the steeple because the drone pictures have identified numerous areas that are leaking. We are waiting on a quote to tell us the extent of the damage.

A member of B&G recently climbed into the attic during a rain storm to witness water infiltrating the attic area. Fortunately, years ago, Jim Shea had strategically staged buckets and tarps for trapping the rain water before it entered our sanctuary. After the steeple and steeple base are repaired, our goal is to repair the sanctuary ceiling and re-paint it. Our immediate concern is to stop the rain from entering. Stay tuned for more information as the situation develops.


