## From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

*“When you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing...”*

—Matthew 6:3

Scholars whom I trust insist that the Sermon on the Mount loses its truth if taken literally. Jesus offers too high a standard, and we cannot ever achieve the righteousness expressed in the Sermon. Instead, our Teacher is calling on us to entrust our growth in faith to God and therefore rise above our own ability. Jesus invites us to rely on God’s righteousness, not our own; to seek God’s holiness, not our own; and to find God’s generosity, not our own.

Therefore, in the last days of April, I write this column with a sense of awe and wonder because I have witnessed this congregation’s continued reliance on God and our faithful growth because of it.

Early in March, members and volunteers, friends and family packed twenty thousand meals into boxes and prepared them for shipping to the Philippines. Six weeks later, we launched into our first fundraiser for next year’s Rise Against Hunger event. This time, we partnered with Delco Gives as a new means for raising the money for our tenth year of Rise Against Hunger. Please see page 8 to learn more of how generous this congregation continues to be while preparing for the next twenty thousand meals.

We have received a couple substantial gifts in the month of April that have startled us with their generosity. These gifts, accompanied by faithful giving from our members and visitors, have helped us recover from the high expenses of snow removal in January and February. More importantly, they will help us to accomplish significant projects and open new horizons for the ministry of Jesus Christ in which we all take part.

**A QUARTERLY STEWARDSHIP UPDATE**  
*from the Finance Committee*

This is a Quarterly summary of our financial standing - a snapshot in time of the first quarter ending 3/31/2026. Pledged & Plate giving has increased over the past two months. January was lower than expected because of the lower attended services due to the snowstorms. We received \$29,466 in March, which is over \$5,000 more than budgeted for the month. We are hopeful this upward trend will continue.

On a positive note, April started strong with \$16,616 in pledged and plate giving during the first two weeks of April. We also received 2 generous gifts. One from the family of a former member and the other was an anonymous gift. We are very grateful for these gifts!

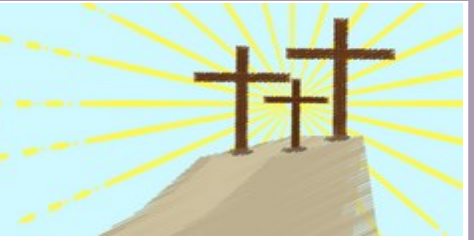

**Meals you packaged are headed to Philippines!**

The Philippines consists of over 7,000 islands in the Ring of Fire in the Pacific Ocean. One of the most environmentally disaster prone countries in the world, it faces near constant threats of natural disasters like earthquakes, typhoons and volcanic eruptions. These disasters cause displacement and major loss of livelihoods and infrastructure, and disproportionately affect poor communities in rural areas, where people rely on agriculture and fishing. The Global Hunger Index, which assesses food insecurity based on indicators that measure undernourishment and undernutrition, categorizes the Philippines as having a "moderate" level of hunger overall. Rise Against Hunger serves the regions of the Philippines where hunger is most urgent.

## Rise Against Hunger & Delco Gives

Every year, we pack 20,000 meals for hungry children around the world - in about two hours! We are planning for our 10th year of meal packaging on March 7, 2027.

Through the amazing work of The Foundation for Delaware County, we hope to reach our goal of \$8,000! That will bring our total meals contributed to 200,000!

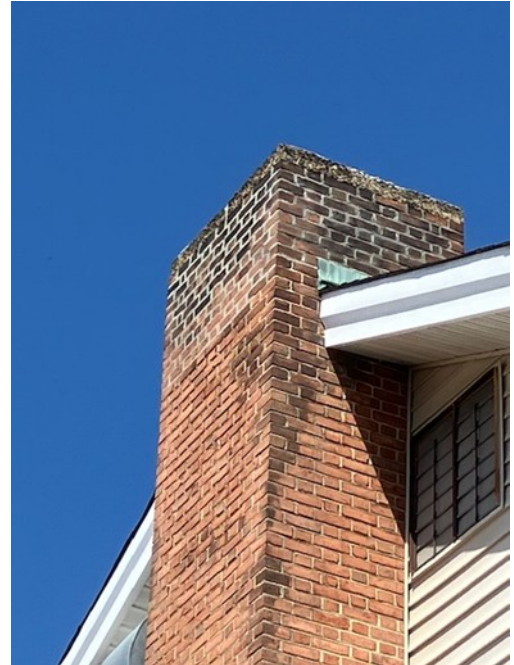
## Church Chimney Repointing

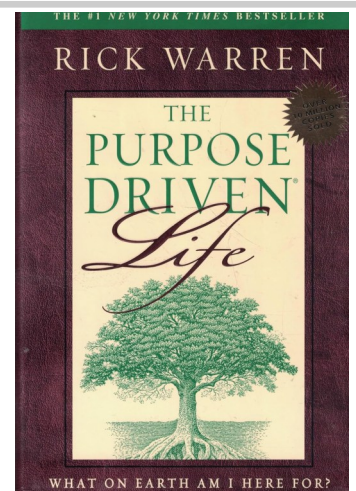

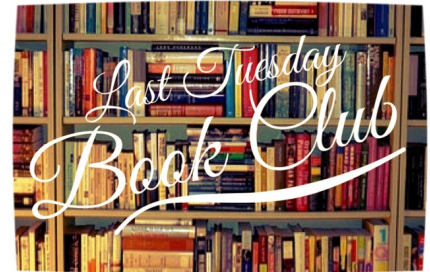
