From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. —Deuteronomy 6:5-7

As this is the beginning of our program year, we thought it appropriate to try something new. This summer, Kristi Schaub and Beth McCarry designed a curriculum for children and youth that communicates what it is to live out the love of God and neighbor. We call the curriculum “Habits of Faith”. You can read more details about it in this newsletter.

In worship and in Adult Bible Study, there will be some weeks where we reflect on the stories from the curriculum, but more often we will consider stories and verses that complement those of the children and youth.

Why not always the same stories? The Word of God, Jesus Christ, who is “the same yesterday and today and forever” (Hebrews 13:8), has spoken through prophets and apostles and through many and various means. No story of his life, ministry, and teaching stands alone, but extends throughout the history and witness of the Bible.

To say this another way: when the children hear the stories of Jesus in Sunday School, they will be able to share with us what they have heard and we will be able to share what we have heard, and together we will listen to the Spirit calling us to live out God’s love.

I am eager to begin this new program year, and I hope you are too. We have an exciting season before us. Kickoff Sunday is September 13, and the Mission Fair is September 27. Read about them, along with other exciting events and opportunities, in this month’s newsletter.

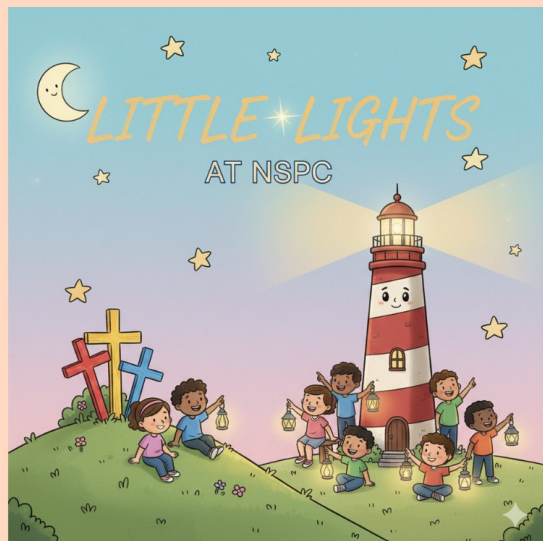

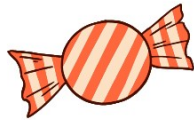

Church World Service Blanket Drive

Church World Service was begun 78 years ago with the mission to “Bring together Christians in the USA with partners worldwide to give and receive Christ’s love in all creation....” With support for so many aide programs having been either reduced or eliminated entirely, the work that Church World Service does now is even more vital than ever. One facet of its many programs is the CWS Blanket Drive.

How many blankets do you have? Only one? That’s doubtful. Perhaps a dozen or more? That’s probably more like it. According to *United Nations News*, currently an estimated 2.8 to 3 billion people worldwide are housing insecure or lack access to safe, affordable and adequate housing. This accounts for roughly 40% of the global population.

These people who are homeless, refugees, survivors of natural disasters or victims of war often have nothing but the clothes on their backs. A simple blanket can provide warmth, be a bed or a pillow, be a privacy divider in a space that houses many families, or may simply let them know that someone somewhere cares about them. Wool blankets are given to people living in frigid temperatures while fleece blankets serve those in warmer climates.

The CWS Blanket Drive has been part of NSPC’s mission outreach for many years. The good news is that they do not cost a lot. One blanket costs \$10; \$25 provides a blanket and hygiene kit; \$30 provides two wool and one fleece blanket; \$45 provides three blankets and a hygiene kit; and \$60 provides three wool and three fleece blankets.

Please consider giving to NSPC’s blanket drive during the month of September. You will find envelopes for your donations in the pew racks or you may send your donation directly to the church. Checks should be made out to NSPC with “CWS Blanket” written in the memo line. Inserts in the Sunday Bulletins will provide more information about the drive. Thank you for doing your part to “Blanket the world with love.”

BUILDING & GROUNDS

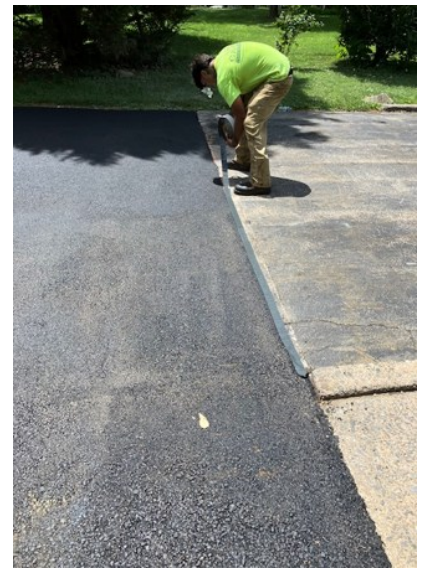
Buildings & Grounds has had a busy summer preparing the building for your return! Check out some of the recent projects.



Rear Driveway Repaving

As you're probably aware, the rear driveway exiting onto Robbins Lane was in very poor condition with extensive cracking and a serious pothole that was becoming larger and deeper with time. In response, the Building and Grounds Committee solicited three quotes for repaving a section of the driveway. The contractor selected to perform the work had a good track record for performing quality work at a reasonable price. Their quote was also the lowest of those solicited. The work was performed after the preschool was no longer in service for the summer. On July 8 the contractor performed the work with a representative from Building & Grounds present. After paving, the driveway was closed for two days to allow for proper curing. The result is a smooth, pothole free driveway which should last for many years.

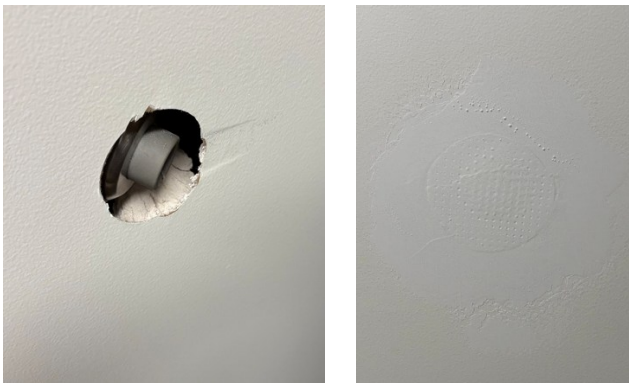


Thanks to Margie Garwood for spending the afternoon organizing the new kitchen arrangement.

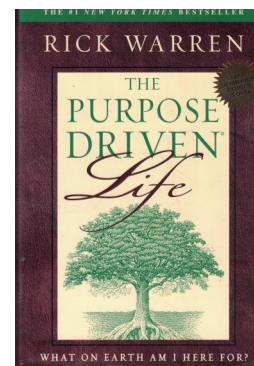

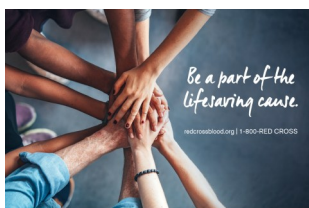
Men's Christian Fellowship
