From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

Most summers of my childhood, my family would fly to Ohio for a weeklong visit to my great-grandfather, William Searight, the Second. During the days, my sister and I would roam the house and neighborhood, playing games of make believe. After dinner, we'd run out to the twilight yard to catch fireflies in jars, ever hopeful that we could discover the secret to keeping them alive through the night so that they could serve us as a nightlight. We'd quickly discover in the morning that even the insects needed to be free to fly and live as they would, a lesson learned and forgotten each year. For the Fourth of July, we'd go with my great-grandfather to his favorite spot to watch a firework show: his local country club. My sister and I would order hamburgers with Cherry Cokes or Shirley Temples and watch the celebratory pyrotechnics through plate glass windows. Only when we wanted to brave the noise would we step outside the nearest door and sit in the grass to marvel at the loud bursts and booms.

I tend to seek out quiet now for each Independence Day. Sure, the noise and spectacle of even the simplest of firework displays can be fun, but I rather wake early and go for a run or walk around dawn. During this quiet time, I say thankful prayers for the many blessings we enjoy and often take for granted in this nation. From the very land beneath our feet to the communities built by people from all over the world, the gifts of God are easy to see here.

For this celebration of two hundred and fifty years of independence, I will remember with thanksgiving those who have worked to bring freedom and to preserve it in this nation, those who have shaped it into what it is. I will also remember with thanksgiving those who challenge us to make it better, those who work to bring about more freedom, and those who remind us to share our many blessings with others. Some such people we already celebrate, with grand displays and noisy fanfare, but most of them do their work out of the spotlight. In the quiet hours of the Fourth of July, I will say prayers for them, as well as for you, your families, and for your celebrations this weekend.

May God, with great compassion and steadfast love, watch over us all.
