

Duties of the pastor

Cannon law, the most exciting study of the Church, outlines the duties of the pastor, the office to which I have been assigned here at St. John's and Blessed Trinity! Technically my title at this point is "Parochial Administrator" but the only real difference between a "Pastor" and what I am right now is how they assign terms. They are often used interchangeably, and practically mean 99% the same thing! Over the next weeks I will outline what my duties are as your "Parochial Administrator".



My first duty in Cannon law is to "to make provision so that the word of God is proclaimed in its entirety to those living in the parish" (Can 528) I am regularly surprised this is the first mentioned duty of the Pastor, because we often think of priests primarily as sacramental ministers. Preaching, teaching, and witnessing to the faith is a foundational duty of the Pastor because no one will know to come to the sacraments if they never hear about them! As you will see, I enjoy teaching and preaching! I get to share what so many others have handed on to me so that I could grow in my relationship with God, and it never gets old being able to help others on their journey.

My dream for St. John's and Blessed Trinity is that you, its people, will be well formed in order to live holy lives in the midst of the world where we are! I hope to teach you not just about what the Church says and how to live it, but maybe most importantly, why it's good for us. I hope to help lay the groundwork so that you know how to grow in relationship with God the thing that will make you truly the happiest! I look forward to preaching to you at Mass, to teaching in classes, and counseling you in the confessional so that we can all grow in holiness, virtue, and happiness.

As always this is started, supported and brought to fruition by the work of the Holy Spirit!


Dear Padre,
