Minutes of Meeting

April 14, 2026

Location: Reidville Presbyterian Church

Mayor Josh Simpson called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Town Administrator Christine McKaba conducted roll call, confirming the presence of Mayor Josh Simpson, Mayor Pro Tem Bob Jordan, and Council Members Amy Gore, James Richard, and Justin Beardsley. The Reidville Town Council was in full attendance. There were 7 people present in the audience.

Councilmember James Richard offered the invocation, followed by the collective recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Amy Gore, seconded by Councilmember Justin Beardsley, to approve the workshop minutes from March 9, 2026, as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Josh Simpson, seconded by Councilmember Amy Gore, to approve the public hearing minutes from March 10, 2026, as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Josh Simpson, seconded by Councilmember Amy Gore, to approve the council meeting minutes from March 10, 2026, as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

Town Administrator confirmed that there were no audience members signed up to speaking in public forum.

Councilmember James Richard gave an update on the local government investment pool account.

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember James Richard, seconded by Councilmember Amy Gore, to accept the March 2026 Financial Report, as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Josh Simpson announced that he was recently sworn in to be a board member of the Municipal Association of South Carolina.

Councilmember Bob Jordan reported that detour signs for the College Street/Chestnut Street intersection had been placed in advance to familiarize residents with the detour route. Mr. Jordan also provided an update on the intersection project, stating that the existing road would be straightened and converted into a four-way stop. Administrator McKaba emphasized that the project would be completed in phases so that Powder Branch subdivision could remain open for right turns. She noted that there would be a brief closure during paving, but it would occur during normal work hours.

Councilmember Justin Beardsley reported that he, Josh, and Christine met with Sheriff Bill Ryne and two other representatives from the Spartanburg County Sheriff's Department. He stated that it was a positive meeting and that they would continue working toward securing coverage for Reidville by a dedicated officer.

Councilmember Amy Gore reminded everyone that the yard sale event currently has only three sign-ups. She stated that if no additional sign-ups are received by Tuesday of next week, they would make a public

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announcement and consider moving the event to a different date. She also noted that the Spring Festival is scheduled for May 16 and could be combined with the yard sale if needed. In addition, she reported that a new German food truck is coming to town and that she has been in communication with them in an effort to have them participate in Oktoberfest. Councilmember Richard asked if the town could plan a community trash day as they have done in prior years. Mrs. Gore and Mrs. McKaba to plan ahead for this event.

Action: A motion was made by Councilmember Justin Beardsley, seconded by Councilmember Bob Jordan, to approve the second and final reading of ordinance 2026-01. The motion passed in favor by Josh Simpson, Bob Jordan, Justin Beardsley, and James Richard. Amy Gore recused herself due to personal interest.

Action: At 6:43 p.m., a motion was made by Mayor Josh Simpson, seconded by Councilmember Bob Jordan, to enter into executive session for the announced and posted reasons. The motion passed unanimously.

Action: At 8:42 p.m., a motion was made by Councilmember Amy Gore, seconded by Councilmember Bob Jordan, to exit executive session and return to open session. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Josh Simpson stated that no decisions were made during the executive session.

Action: At 8:43 p.m., a motion was made by Mayor Josh Simpson, seconded by Councilmember Bob Jordan, to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously.
