Year	Place	Country	Key Phenomenon	Scientific/Church Status
1992–1996	Buenos Aires	Argentina	Host becomes cardiac tissue	Scientific analysis; widely recognized
2001	Chirattakonam	India	Image forms on Host	Diocesan verification
2006	Tixtla	Mexico	Host exudes blood-like substance	Scientific analysis; diocesan approval
2008	Sokolka	Poland	Host becomes cardiac tissue	Scientific confirmation; diocesan approval
2013	Legnica	Poland	Host shows heart tissue	Scientific confirmation; approved for veneration
