Why We Pray for the Dead (Part 2)

The Biblical and Early Christian Foundation
Catholics believe in praying for the dead because it is supported by Scripture and early Church practice. In the Second Book of Maccabees, we read that Judas Maccabeus took up a collection for a sin offering for soldiers who had died in battle: "It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins" (2 Maccabees 12:46). While not part of the Protestant canon, this passage is considered inspired Scripture in Catholic and Orthodox traditions.

The early Christians celebrated the Eucharist at the graves of martyrs and prayed for all the departed,

graves of martyrs and prayed for all the departed,
asking God to grant them rest and peace. The
catacombs are full of inscriptions such as "May you live
in God" or "Peace be with you." These are more than
farewell messages—they are prayers in hope of the
resurrection.
