Why We Pray for the Dead (Part 4)

The Communion of Saints

The Church teaches that all believers, living and dead, are part of one communion of saints—a spiritual solidarity that transcends time and death. This unity allows us to pray for the dead, just as we ask the saints in Heaven to pray for us.

In this communion, love does not end at the grave. Instead, it is fulfilled. Our prayers become acts of love and remembrance, not because we seek to control the fate of souls, but because we remain connected in the Body of Christ.

As Pope Benedict XVI once said, "No one sins alone. No one is saved alone."

Praying for the dead is also a deeply personal act. When we light a candle, offer a Rosary, or have a Mass said for a loved one, we are expressing our enduring love for them. We are saying: You are not forgotten. You are still part of us. We entrust you to God's mercy.
