

What does a proper notarization include?

The Elements of a Proper Notarization:

Notary's Commissioned Name - Printed or on the Stamp State of Michigan County of (County Where Notary is Commissioned) The statement "My Commission Expires" (date) Acting in the County of (County where feet are planted at the time of notarization) All of the above can be on a stamp. Along with the above: The date of notarization - no backdating or forward dating is legal The Signature of the Notary

How Much S	hould I Expect to Pay?	
\$10	Per Notarization	
\$5-\$40	For the Notary to Travel to you	
\$5-\$10	If the notary prints documents for you	

Do I Need to Be Sworn In?

You Might! Look at the notarial block. Does it say "Subscribed and Sworn Before Me"? If so, yes, the notary should issue an Oath.

Does it say, "Acknowledged before me?" If so, then no, you don't have to be sworn in.
