



“But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.”

Isaiah 40: 31 KJV



Eagles are included in the Bible as a bird of strength, with keen eyesight, that “soar” through the skies:

- 27 “Does the eagle soar at your command, and build its nest on high?
28 It dwells on a cliff and stays there at night; a rocky crag is its stronghold.
29 From there it looks for food; its eyes detect it from afar.”

Job 39: 27-29 NIV

Just as eagles are viewed as powerful birds in the Bible, people who put trust in the Lord, may be encouraged to “soar higher” in faith and find strength to endure “the skies” of life’s challenges. Unlike other birds, eagles may fly above the storm/rain clouds.

In 1782, “By approval from the Continental Congress, the eagle was named as a national emblem.” The eagle appears on U.S. currency, official documents, and the presidential seal.

Eagles have an ability to fly toward the sun, without rays damaging their eyes, soar at high altitudes, and have been known to build eyries (nests) weighing record amounts. A nearly 2 ton eyrie was recorded in Vermilion, Ohio. The Ohio eyrie withstood weather conditions for approximately 30 years. Eagles return to the nest yearly instead of rebuilding. Heavy tree limbs/branches and weighty articles of clothing have been used for nest materials. This summer, as our country marks 250 years, you may “spot” an eagle, which was referenced in the Old Testament, not only in the wild, but “displayed” on national symbols.
