WELCOME TO ST. AGNES

Please know that, whoever you are and from wherever you have come, you are welcome in God's house. May every heart be warmed by God's presence.

Church Plaza—In May of 2006, we expanded the simple sidewalk, that led to the front door of the church, into a wider area or a plaza. The plaza provides more room outside the church for when people might gather after Mass. At that same time, benches were added and lights that provide more illumination outside the church during the evening hours. Part of the plaza project was the insertion of ornamental stones with various symbols. Several parishioners made donations toward these ornamental stones and the plaza. For the most part, there are two stones with the same symbol. With the approach of the 20th "anniversary" of the plaza, we might run in the bulletin, from time to time, an explanation of the meaning of the symbols.

Shamrock

One of the symbols that appears on two of the stones is a shamrock. Although a shamrock is sometimes used as a sign of things Irish, it is more properly a sign of the Blessed Trinity. According to tradition, it is said that St. Patrick held



up a shamrock, or three-leaf clover, when he was teaching the Catholic faith to the people of Ireland. He is reported to have said as there are three leaves to a shamrock, yet one shamrock, so there are three persons to god, yet one God. The comparison is limited, of course, because one person of the trinity is not one-third of God while each leaf

of the shamrock is on-third of the whole. When you see the shamrock in the plaza, let it be a reminder of the Triune God, one in three. May it remind us of various expressions of our belief in the Trinity: in the words of the sign of the Cross, in the prayer the "Glory Be," and in the expression of basic beliefs in the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds. May our prayer always be that we, the members of the Church, might share more deeply in, and better express, the love and unity of the Blessed Trinity.
