Our **Monitoring & Evaluation Framework**, developed in collaboration with our partner projects and an advisory committee, uses common indicators and case studies to measure sustained positive change in three areas:

Program Outcomes

Improved access to education as indicated by the number of students directly benefiting from educational programs.

Student Outcomes

Improved quality of teaching and learning as indicated by the number of students graduating to the next level or employed.

Societal Outcomes

Transformed communities as indicated by the number of individuals engaged in developing themselves and contributing to the betterment of their families and communities.

Meena is now a lawyer



Meena graduated from Prerna Girls School in 2014. She recently completed her Bachelor of Law degree from the University of Lucknow and is now pursuing her master's degree in law. Meena's father could not study or go to school because he is categorized as a dalit (the lowest caste in India). Meena says that her father is very proud of her achievements. In his youth, her father was falsely convicted and imprisoned because he did not have access to a lawyer to argue his case. This is why Meena chose to become a lawyer.

"The teachers welcome every girl at Prerna along with the problems that girls face in their life. They help each girl to solve these problems. The education that Prerna gave me empowered me to fight my battles on my own and become the person I am today."

From child bride to community activist



Preeti, a 24-year-old mother of four, came to Study Hall Educational Foundation (SHEF) almost three years ago to enroll her daughters at Prerna School. Preeti had a troubled childhood and at age 8 started working

with her mother as domestic help and looking after siblings and house chores. She was forced into a child marriage to a 30-year-old man when she was 11 and had her first child at age 13.

By the time Preeti was 19, both her parents and her in-laws had passed away. The same year, she became a widow as her husband died from liver failure due to alcohol abuse. Determined to give her daughters a good future, Preeti worked in five houses to barely make ends meet and to send her daughters to school. When she came to Prerna to enroll her 11-year-old daughter, Rakhee Panjwani, principal of Prerna, asked Preeti to also enroll herself and her two other daughters. Her 4 year old son will be enrolled later when he is 6 years old.

Preeti is now studying in an accelerated learning program and has left the informal working sector to work part time in SHEF's outreach office focused on prevention of child marriage and violence against women and girls.
