





The Signs of the Times...



There are many signs in the Church, beginning with the sign that we make at the beginning and end of Mass: The Sign of the Cross — the instrument through which Our Lord saved us. Signs often speak more than words, for they bring about an invisible, unspoken reality. Whenever we make the Sign of the Cross, we are visibly reminding ourselves that we belong to Christ.

The sacraments, too, can be spoken of as signs — visible realities that bring about an invisible reality. And what is that reality? It is the fact that God, in Jesus and the Holy Spirit, continues to redeem us, sanctify us, and setting us free from our ailments in Baptism, Confirmation, Confession, Anointing of the Sick, Marriage, Holy Orders, and the most precious sacrament of all, the reason why the Church exists: the Eucharist, for in it, He assure of is presence until the end of the age.

The Eucharist is "the source and summit of our faith; all other sacraments are ordered toward it" (CCC 1324), that is, the whole order of grace in the sacraments finds its source and its fulfillment in the Eucharist.

The Eucharist is also the sacrament of friendship and unity in Christ, and so with the desire to make the sign of the sacrament more visible at all of our six Masses, we are extending the distribution of the Precious Blood to the 12:00 p.m. Mass beginning the First Sunday of Advent. Last year, we began Communion under both kinds at the 4:00 p.m. and the 10:30 a.m. Masses, and we hope to extend it to all the Masses in the future.

It is important to note that when we line up to receive the Eucharist — in either or both kinds — we must be prayerfully disposed so that we know Who it is we are receiving: the God of the universe, the God who made you, the God who redeemed you. It is not a piece of bread, a cracker, or a cookie, but truly the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord.

And so, please receive, treat, and consume the Eucharist with the knowledge that it is Jesus' Body and Blood, He who became our "Pasch" (CCC 1324) — our salvation, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.



Guidelines:

As you approach the Eucharistic Minister, you may receive the Eucharist on the tongue or in the hand. If receiving on the tongue, please extend your tongue so the minister can safely place the Eucharist without touching your tongue. If receiving in the hand, please extend your hands to the minister so the Eucharist can be safely placed there. **Do not grab it** — **receive it.** Please consume the Eucharist immediately.

If, <u>for any reason</u>, <u>you cannot receive the Eucharist</u>, cross your arms over your chest. This will be a visible sign for the minister to give you a blessing instead of the Eucharist.

Parents: If your child has not received First Communion, please have him or her cross their arms over their chest as they approach the minister. If your child has received First Communion and desires to receive the Precious Blood, we leave that to your discretion. - Fr. Rodrigo


