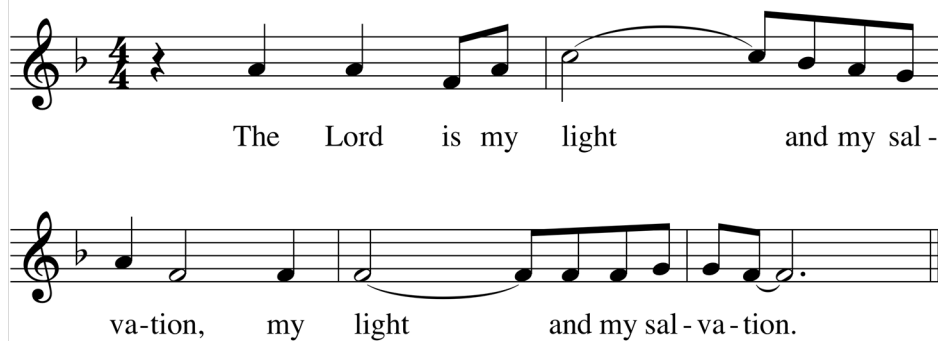

Nicene Creed
