

Reflection from Pastor John Denton

Proverbs 29:18 says, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." This is true in our personal lives and in our church. If we lived life with no vision, no plan, and no direction, we would wander aimlessly. It would be a challenge to accomplish the task if we didn't even know what it was we were trying

to do.

In the church, it is important that we have a vision for the future—a vision that not only builds God's Kingdom, but also reminds us that God's Kingdom is breaking into our world today.

If we don't know where we are going, it's hard to get there.

Every Sunday during the offertory, I make the proclamation that at Grace we *Worship, Group, and Give*. But what does that mean exactly?



We Worship. Every Sunday morning we gather at 10a.m. for joyful praise. The Good News of Jesus Christ is proclaimed, and the congregation is activated to join with Jesus in ministry. Through worship, connections are made: first-time visitors are welcomed with a gift, invited to lunch, and encouraged to attend our Sunday morning "How to Read the Bible" class.

We Group. We are relational. We fellowship together. We have specific times and places where this happens, and people make deeper connections. We have small groups, Bible studies, and Sunday School. These groups are not just for a select few—they welcome everyone. There are open doors and open seats. We group in membership through our membership class, learning what it means not just to attend church but to be a follower of Jesus at Grace Presbyterian Church.

We Give. Giving our time, talent, and treasures is a sign of surrendered living. We serve not only within our congregation, but also outwardly in the city of Vista and throughout the world. All that we have and all that we do is a response to what Jesus is doing in our lives. This spirit of generosity leads to faithful stewardship. It is also through giving that many are called to serve as leaders in the church—as committee members, Deacons, or Elders.

We worship, we group, and we give—with that one person Jesus has placed on our hearts in mind. What step are you at in our engagement pathway? How have you seen this play out in the life of our church? Let's keep living a life of vision together.

The Joy of Giving

"Encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone." 1 Thess. 5:12

t had been a dreary week. I had been feeling lethargic and listless, although I couldn't figure out why.

Near the end of the week, I found out that an aunt had kidney failure. I knew I had to visit her – but to be honest, I felt like postponing the visit. Still, I made my way to her place, where we had dinner, chatted, and prayed together. An hour later, I left her home feeling upbeat for the first time in days. Focusing on someone else rather than myself had somehow improved my mood.

Psychologists have found that the act of giving can produce satisfaction, which comes when the giver sees the recipient's gratitude. Some experts even believe that humans are wired to be generous!

Perhaps that's why Paul, when encouraging the church in Thessalonica to build up their faith community, urged them to "help the weak" (1 Thessalonians 5:14). Earlier, he had also cited Jesus's words, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). While this was said in the context of giving financially, it applies as well to the giving of time and effort.

When we give, we get an insight into how God feels. We understand why He's so delighted to give us His love, and we share in His joy and the satisfaction of blessing others. I think I'll be visiting my aunt more often.


Missions: Special Offering

Presbyterians help transform lives through our work for peace, with the tools God has given us. Together, in the Spirit of God, we work



Our Thursday morning Bible Study is focusing on the Biblical Book of Daniel. We are using the book called "Be Resolute" by Warren Wiersbe. When we got to chapter 10 he wrote a section called The Invisible War. He referred to a heavenly war going on between the forces of evil and the forces of God. He even wrote of the angel Gabriel who was delayed in getting to Daniel to interpret his vision because of the evil deeds of the King of Persia.

This month's GP Hot Topic: THE INVISIBLE WAR

Grandparents, are we involved in an Invisible War for the souls of our children and grandchildren. I say yes! Can these forces be hard to see. I say yes!

As we look at the lives of our children and grandchildren, can we ask 'how much time do they spend with the Lord'. In there you can find the Invisible War at work. Here are some things to look for to "see" the Invisible War.

- Listen to their language. Is it kind? Does it show a concern for others. Does it ever blaspheme the Lord?
- > Do they read the Bible or anything that is faith related. The longer they are in school the more time they will spend reading. Make sure it is wholesome reading.
- > Do they make time to worship. Yes, especially sports/band seem to have the priority these days. Can they find time outside of school work and sporting/musical events to worship?
- ➤ How do they relate around their peers? Are they an example or a follower?
- > Do they reject ungodly behavior in others?
- Are they concerned about the world around us?

There are probably more but what can we, as grandparents, do to help our grandchildren fight this Invisible War?

We must be like the angel Gabriel who, although late, was able to win the battle against evil. I will mention that Gabriel got some help...the angel Michael was able to team up and help win the battle. Can we as grandparents team-up in prayer to help win the souls of our grandchildren for our Lord? The answer to that is easy. Yes, we can!

Put on the full armor of God and fight! (Read Ephesians 6). Remember we can be like God's angels. If we need help, ask!

- Prayer: Dear Father, you have left us instructions on what to do to lead our children and grandchildren on your path. Please help us to know what you want us to do. Forgive us Lord when we don't do it. In your Son's name and in gratitude for what He has done. Amen.
- **Action:** Keep your eyes open for evidence of the Invisible War going on in your grandchildren. Then do something!
