Stewardship Corner

Stewardship and Thanksgiving

"Give thanks to the Lord and proclaim His greatness. Let the whole world know what He has done."

Psalm 105:1

The first recorded Thanksgiving celebration was a harvest feast in 1621 between the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag tribe, where they gave thanks to God for his provision. It was officially established as a national holiday in an 1863 proclamation by President Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War and was celebrated at different times by different states. In 1941 President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed a bill that set the date for Thanksgiving as the 4th Thursday of November.

November is also Stewardship month at Grace Presbyterian Church when we celebrate God's provision during the year and pledge our financial giving for the coming year.

So, what does stewardship have to do with Thanksgiving?

- Stewardship is an act of Thanksgiving. Stewardship is the "privilege of responding to God's love with thanksgiving and gratitude," recognizing that everything is a gift from God to be managed wisely.
- Thanksgiving is the foundation of stewardship. The spirituality of stewardship is rooted in recognizing God's greatness and not grasping things selfishly. It starts with an attitude of thanksgiving which leads to the desire to use God's gifts to glorify Him.
- Giving in gratitude, we return a portion of what God has given us back to Him, not because we are returning what is ours, but because we are giving back what is His in a spirit of thankfulness.

In daily gratitude, regularly reflecting on and thanking God for the gifts received is a practice of daily stewardship that fosters a grateful heart.

It's November and it's just a slide to December. Our minds begin to plan. I have heard that more families join together for Thanksgiving than Christmas. Let's take a look at those holidays to see how we can make them holy days: To please our Lord ... and still keep our grandkids interest. This month's GP Hot Topic: MAKING HOLIDAYS HOLY DAYS

Let's consider being at the table as that is often where the family will actually be together. Of course, there are lots of conversations going on but the one time when it stops...momentarily is blessing the meal: saying "Grace". Who is chosen to say Grace? Is it an adult who prays easily or is one of the children asked to say it, usually shorter. Often when we eat at my daughter's house, it is my granddaughter, Lily who says the Grace.

(You met her on Grandparents Day of Prayer in September.) It really doesn't matter who says the Grace. Some families pray around the table for things they are thankful for. This is a great idea, and can even be highlighted separately from blessing of the food.

Maybe Grace can be carried through the entire day. How?

• When talking to anyone be courteous, humble and Christlike. Our 2014: a few friends – no kids speech should be truthful. We should always make the person (especially our grandchildren) feel good after you finish talking.

• Listen to what our grandchildren have to say if we want them to listen to us. Our focus here is our grandchildren but this applies to everyone we talk to during the holiday.

• Take every opportunity to share your faith. When Grace is said and you are moved by the words, especially if a child has prayed or anyone, mention what was said and how it touched you.

BRING YOUR FAITH TO THE TABLE!

- If there is sadness in the gathering, mention the hope we have in our Lord.
- Use joy (either yours or for another).

Whether Thanksgiving or Christmas, these are times to be Christlike. Try to dismiss the hecticness and materialism on these special days to make them what they are intended to be: a Christlike celebration (yes, even the pilgrims.)



- Prayer: Our Lord, we are thankful for the many blessings that you shower on us day to day. We are grateful for you, our Father. We, as grandparents, look to you for guidance as we portray your blessings in grace-filled behavior. For you we are thankful. In your Son's name we pray. Amen.
- Action: Bring happiness on Thanksgiving Day...along with turkey, stuffing, green beans, etc....
- A Thought and a Smile: There's always something to be thankful for.
