



Reflection from Pastor John Denton

The Christmas season always reminds us of how quickly time passes. We see it most clearly in our children—growing up faster than we could ever imagine. We also feel it when we think about the people who are not with us this Christmas, or when we realize how many years it has been

since we lost someone we love. For some, Christmas arrives with great joy. For others, it comes with real concerns, sorrow, or grief.

In the church we call this season Advent—the weeks from Sunday, November 30th through Christmas Eve, December 24th. Advent comes from a Latin word meaning arrival or coming. It is a season of waiting, preparation, and anticipation. Because of the birth of Jesus Christ, we have great hope that life will not always remain as it is—that our world has been forever changed. The dullness, the grief, the fears, the worries (the list can feel long, can't it?)— all of these things that stand in the way of true Christmas joy will ultimately be replaced by the love and comfort of Jesus, our infant Redeemer.





So I ask: What are you hoping for this Christmas? What are you expecting? What are you waiting for?

In my own home, I look at my oldest daughter—13 years old—as we

prepare to choose a high school next month, as we look at college sports camps over the winter break, and I realize: we only have five more Christmas mornings with her until she is off to college. I find myself wondering, Have we created meaningful

traditions as a family? Has Christmas been a time of expectant joy for her? Does she carry the same excitement about the birth of Jesus that I do?

Our family has many Advent traditions—the Advent calendar, picking out the perfect Christmas tree, cruising the neighbor-

hood in our '67 Mustang looking at lights, watching every Christmas movie far too many times, the candlelight Christmas Eve service, Christmas Eve dinner at In-N-Out, me squeezing into the same Santa suit every year to surprise the kids, opening Christmas pajamas on Christmas Eve, and waking up Christmas morning to read the birth narrative of Jesus from the Gospel of Matthew. If you asked my kids, I'm sure they could list even more. These traditions build anticipation for the arrival of Jesus, strengthen our family, and fill our home with expectant joy.

Some of you are just beginning your family's story. Others are watching from the outside as grown children carry these traditions into their own homes. And still others are waiting—praying for a Christmas miracle to break into a broken world.

Wherever you find yourself this year, let me encourage you: start a new tradition, or invite someone new into a favorite tradition of the past. Don't miss the miracle.

And I want to personally invite you to be part of one of our most meaningful traditions—the Candlelight Christmas Eve Service at Grace, December 24 at 7:00pm.

"If we love one another, God lives in us and His love is made complete in us." 1 John 4:12

Anne Frank, a Jewish girl who kept a diary while hiding from Nazi soldiers during their occupation of the Netherlands, penned these words: "No one has ever become poor by giving." Indeed, in many ways we are made spiritually rich by giving.

In John 3:16 we read that "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." This passage tells us something about the nature of love.

We read that God so loved the world that he gave his Son. From this we learn that love involves giving. If we love, we give. When we truly have love in our hearts, we are willing to give of our time, energy, finances and other resources to help others and to minister to them.

God has shown us love by giving us His Son, and when His love fills our hears through faith, it transforms us. We become more Christlike and we want to share God's love in everything we do. Through giving and living out our love, which comes from God, we also find we are blessed with the spiritual richness of knowing that "If we love one another, God lives in us."

When you think of December, does shopping come first to your mind, whether it be for food or gifts? Materialism is a topic that blossoms in December. Three of my 4 grandchildren are teens. What do you get teens these days and still have a bank account? Giving is something our faith wants us to do and, in our gifts, we need to honor our Lord's birth and as Christians we try to display our Lord's birth: a manger scene, the cards we send out, worship services. But how do we act when we receive a gift?

GOD'S WORD: "remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' Acts 20:35

This month's GP Hot Topic: BLESSED TO RECEIVE

Let's take a look at GOD'S WORD printed above. First, we must realize that nowhere is our bible does Jesus say this. So, we have to believe that Paul (who wrote Acts) possibly heard it said or quoted somewhere. Or it is very believable that Paul was inspired by God to say this.

You choose.

However, it is not in the giving that we want to focus on in this Christmas newsletter. It is likely that there will be gift exchanges and we, as grandparents, may receive some. How do we feel when someone gives us a gift that we really like? Do we make the comment "O, you shouldn't have?" If we take our comment and put it in relation to Paul's statement in Acts, what are we really saying? Are we saying "Don't be blessed for giving this to me". We must be gracious in the receiving because the person who gave is being blessed for the giving of it and we want to confirm that.

Check out a few verses from Romans: v8.2 because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. v15.5 May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had



The Lord's giving showers his blessings upon us, believers. Yes, we are grateful for His gift and acknowledge his giving as worthy and our acceptance as lifesaving. So, with the next gift we receive let's look upon the giver as being blessed. Encourage that idea because that person wanted to see us happy and is blessed for that.

Let us grandparents look into that manger wherever it is in our home and look at the giver of that babe and what it means to our lives. We certainly don't want to say "O, you shouldn't have."

- Prayer: Father, we thank you for your Son. We acknowledge the blessings you bring forth to those who give. We want to be like you. In Jesus we pray. Amen
- Action: This Christmas, let's look at each person giving us gifts and say "I'm so glad you gave this to me", remembering how we are so glad God gave us his Son
