Reflection from Pastor John Denton

Believe it or not, Ash Wednesday is just a few weeks away. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season, the start of Jesus' path to the cross. On this day we are reminded of our mortality and the truth that we belong to Christ. During Lent, we journey through the ashes, which lead us not only to Jesus' death on Good Friday, but ultimately to the joy of resurrection on Easter Sunday.

This year, I want to encourage you to take on a Lenten practice—either by starting something new to strengthen your spiritual life or by removing something that has become a distraction, creating more space to surrender control to the Lord.

In my own life, I often see Lent as an opportunity to remove distractions. When we fast, we declare that food does not have power over us. When we give up daily phone usage, we say our devices do not control us. When we step away from television, we affirm that we are made for more than consuming content. Would your life look different if you removed some of these distractions? Would you find yourself more focused on the Lord if your attention wasn't pulled in so many other directions?

As you remove distractions, what might happen if you added a spiritual discipline in their place? What if you intentionally set aside time each day for prayer? What if you walked your neighborhood and prayed for each home? Could you replace television with Scripture reading for the 40 days of Lent? Consider adding practices such as prayer, fasting, Sabbath-keeping, gratitude, hospitality, journaling, solitude, or generosity—giving what you would normally spend.

As we enter the Lenten season, let us desire what God desires. As James K. A. Smith writes, "Jesus's command to follow him is a command to align our loves and longings with his—to want what God wants, to desire what God desires, to hunger and thirst after God and crave a world where he is all in all—a vision encapsulated by the shorthand 'the kingdom of God.'"

Less of us, more of God.

"We love, because He first loved us." (1 Jn 4:19)

Americans are projected to spend a record \$27.5 billion for Valentine's Day, averaging about \$188.81 per person, with significant spending on significant others, family pets and coworkers, including popular gifts like candy, flowers, jewelry and dining out. These gifts are meant to show love for those who love them.

In 1 John 4:16,19 John tell us "We have come to know and have believed the love which God has for us. God is love, and the one who remains in love remains in God, and God remains in him.... We love, because He first loved us." Also, in John 3:16, Jesus says: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life."

Jesus, in Revelation 2:4, in His letter to the church in Ephesus, commends them for their deeds and their labor and perseverance, but criticizes them by writing: "But I have this against you, that you have left your first love."

This Valentine's Day, when you are giving gifts to show your love, don't forget your first love. Think of all God has provided because He loves you. Show your love by giving a gift to support God's work on this earth.



As we wrap up the month of January, our preschool has been filled with joy, learning, and spiritual growth. We were excited to welcome our students back after Christmas break and jump right into a new lesson focus: **self-control**.



Using the Bible story *Jesus Tested in the Desert*, our teachers helped students understand what temptation is and how we can stay strong through it. The children were given real-life examples they could relate to and were presented with a small piece of candy. They were told, "We know it is hard and we are tempted, but the rule is that we cannot eat it." The teacher explained that if they were able to listen and resist the temptation, they would receive something better—without telling them what it would be. At the end of the lesson, the students were rewarded with a mini cupcake for their self-control!



This hands-on activity helped our students understand that when we push away small temptations, it is often for something bigger and better—just like the love of Jesus. We don't need to choose things that feel good right away when we trust that Jesus will provide what we truly need. Impulse control is hard even for adults, and giving our students a safe and meaningful way to practice now helps set them up to make better choices in the future.

In addition to our Bible lessons, January was filled with winter learning! Our students explored cold weather and Arctic animals. They worked together to build an igloo, created dens for hibernation, and learned about camouflage—encouraging creativity, teamwork, and problem-solving.



Looking ahead to **February**, we will be focusing on **kindness** through the story of The Good Samaritan. We are also excited to welcome **three new students** to our program this month! In January, we were blessed to add a new staff member as well—please join us in welcoming **Ms. Abby** to our preschool family.

We are so grateful to witness what God is doing through our teachers and students each day and look forward to all that February will bring.



She never complained once and often reminded us that we were welcome to stay as long as we wanted even if that meant forever. That time gave us so many opportunities to have long talks in her hot tub, countless family dinners, and memories that I will now hold near and dear to my heart. This is just one of the many examples of how Baby Jo supported me in one of my hardest moments."

JoAnn wore her faith on her shirtsleeve.

"She was a woman of God, a true faithful servant to the Catholic faith.

She was a family woman through and through. If you knew her, she loved you unconditionally. She would welcome you in with open arms no matter your life story."

She left a legacy and minds full of memories.

"The point is, there will never quite be another woman like my Baby Jo. Though there is a void in so many of our hearts without her, I am so grateful to be a recipient of her love for the last 30 years"

My niece has left memories for all of us who knew her. We, as grandparents, need to intentionally do this while we still walk on this earth. We need to create memories that will last longer than we do. Talk, pass on an ancestral item, write your feelings down and make sure they read it, help them if needed and let them know you love the Lord. There are many more opportunities that life will create. And what is best of all is our Lord has provided memory so our loved one will stay with us.


