

Reflection from Pastor John Denton

his Sunday we had 11 guests! I love hearing that! These are the kinds of messages I live for—people are visiting Grace Presbyterian Church. That means a few things:

We are visible—people know we exist.

We are inviting—people are being welcomed in.

This year I've been laser-focused not only on meeting our 5% growth goal, but on breaking the

100-person barrier for in-person worship. Why? Because reaching 100 puts us in the top 25% of churches in the United States. It means we're maximizing our facility, preparing to grow our staff, and managing the costs of ministry wisely.

But let me be clear—this isn't about becoming a "mega



church." It's about stewardship. It's about taking care of the resources God has given us so they can be used for His glory.

So why am I so passionate about this? Because people need Jesus. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to make disciples. That's multiplication—taking what Jesus is doing in us and allowing it to multiply in others. We're not just trying to keep the lights on—we're following Jesus. And here's the good news: when we follow Him, the lights don't just stay on—they burn brightly. The campus doesn't just get used—it becomes a place where God's glory is made visible.

When I first came to Grace in 2022, my daughter's teacher asked me about the church I pastored. When I told her it was Grace, she said, "Oh, I thought that church closed down." From that moment on, one of my goals has been to make sure people driving by our campus know without a doubt—we are alive, open, praying for them, and ready to welcome them in.

That's why building a culture of invitation matters. Yes, some people might stop by on their own. But our mandate is to make disciples, and that means inviting, welcoming, and helping people grow in their faith at Grace.

On September 7th we celebrate our Fall Kickoff; Rally Day! Let's rally together to break 100 in worship that day, and step into the fall ready to grow as a church family.

A Strong Church

"And he went through Syria and Cilicia, strengthening the churches." Acts 15:41

When Jesus returned to heaven, He only ordained one organization to continue His work on earth: His Church. How wonderful we can do as Paul did – going around strengthening the Church.

Grace Preschool: Walking in Faith, Learning with Joy


e are so excited to share that we have officially begun our second school year here at Grace Presbyterian Church Preschool! It is a true blessing to walk alongside this church




family as we nurture, teach, and grow with the children entrusted to our care.


Romans 14:19: "Pursue What Makes for Peace"
