Dear Parishioners.

This Sunday we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Church at Rome. This is the Cathedral of the Roman Church. It was originally dedicated in the 4th Century. The Church has been updated many times and has been rebuilt after a fire. It is dedicated to both St. John the Baptist and the Apostle John. The images of the Roman Pontiffs are on the walls. The Pope offers mass there periodically as part of his duty as bishop of Rome. At other times a cardinal is appointed to attend to the needs of the Cathedral Church of Rome. Interesting to note that the Church property donated belonged to the Laterani family and dedicated by Pope Sylvester I. In the year 324. The cathedral is a sign of the unity of all the Churches in union with the Pope. St. Peter was the one who Identified Christ as the Son of the Living God and Christ declared him as the rock upon which the Church was built. The Church is a body, a living organism that is enlivened by the Holy Spirit and Christ dwells within. The Church is also symbolized in the places of worship where God comes to make himself present in the Word and in the Most Blessed Sacrament. The Cathedral Church of Rome is where the successor to St. Peter presides and is a sign of the unity of Rome with all the diocesan Churches of the Holy Roman Catholic Faith.

As we celebrate the Dedication today, may we be renewed in our Faith in Christ and in His Church. May the wonder of God's providential care and guidance inspire us to actively participate in our local Church in union with Christ and Pope Leo XIV and our local bishops.
