2024-2025 PRE-REGISTRATION FORM

It is hard to believe we are making preparations for the next school year. We anticipate that our enrollment will continue to increase next school year. We already have many new families interested in SAS for next year. It is important to turn in your Pre-Registration form and fee in a timely manner to ensure your child is included in our enrollment for next year. This also helps us to plan the budget for the upcoming year, as well as class sizes and number of teachers needed. Current families risk being put on a waiting list if the Pre-Registration form is not returned by the deadline!

The registration fee of \$75 per student AND the registration form is due by January 26, 2024. After January 26th, the registration fee will increase to \$100. The registration fee is non-refundable. After January 26, we will also open registration for new families.

On the appropriate line of the Pre-Registration Form, write the names of your children who will be attending Saint Anthony School for the 2024-2025 school year. You may also complete the online form and send your fee into the office.

How Sick is too Sick?

This information sheet is designed to be used as a general guidance for parents. If parents have medical questions, they are encouraged to consult with a healthcare provider.

Symptom	Send to School	Keep at Home
Fever	During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been below 100.4 degrees and no fever-reducing medication has been taken.	During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been more than 100.4 degrees.
Diarrhea	During the past 24 hours, no more than one watery stool has occurred.	During the past 24 hours, more than one watery stool has occurred.
Vomiting	During the past 24 hours, no vomiting has occurred.	During the past 24 hours, vomiting has occurred.
Eye Irritation	Eyes may be itchy, but are not red, crusty, or draining.	Eyes are pink, draining, crusty, itching, painful, sensitive to light, or student has vision changes.
Cough/Runny Nose	Slight cough or runny nose, but no fever, and the student is able to cover cough, blow nose, and wash hands.	Symptoms are severe enough that the student is unable to learn. The student has a fever, or is unable to cover cough, blow nose, or wash hands.
Rash	Rash is not draining or spreading. The student does not have a fever, and symptoms of itching are not severe enough to impede learning.	Rash is bothersome and distracting. The student has a fever or severe itching, or rash is spreading or draining.
Asthma	Symptoms are well controlled, and the student knows when to contact a school adult for assistance or the student has an asthma action plan on file at the school and is following the plan.	Symptoms are not well controlled. The student is not able to recognize when he/she needs assistance, and no asthma action plan is on file at the school.

Please remember that students must be fever free for 24 hours, without fever reducing medications, in order to return to school. If a student is vomiting or has diarrhea, then students need to be free of vomiting and diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school. Please, Please, Please do not send your child to school if they are not feeling well. We want everyone to do their part in keeping everyone healthy and safe.

This Friday is Stewardship Friday!

Kindergarten – Students will learn that our body is a blessing. A guest speaker will teach students about hearing loss, hearing aids, sign language, and deaf culture.

1st Grade - Students are working on their Shoes for Someone special project.

2nd Grade - Students will read the book Stone Soup and learn that people coming together with many small contributions can have a BIG impact.

3rd Grade - Students will learn about the importance of Dignity for the aging.

4th Grade – Students will watch a Global Story movie about a person who helps those with disabilities in another country.

5th Grade – Students will learn about real ways that they can encourage other kids struggling with chronic illness. They will begin their Joke Jar project.

6th Grade – Students will watch a video about a family formed through adoption.

7th Grade - Students will watch videos and hear stories about how homeless neighbors may struggle with tasks and activities we take for granted.

8th Grade – Students will hear case studies about students who encountered obstacles to education and will learn resiliency to overcome barriers to become successful.








Family Corner





1 Sam 3:3-19 The call of Samuel the prophet.

- 1) As a child did you ever run to your parents room because you were afraid? What were you afraid of then? And now?
- 2) Do you have trouble getting to sleep? What do you do to help you sleep?
- 3) Like Samuel, when did you encounter God in a personal way?
- 4)How do you hear the voice of the Lord? Reading Sacred Scripture? During prayer before the Eucharist? The Holy Spirit speaking within me? Though the priest's homily? Spoken words from an unlikely source?
- 5) How have you and God been communicating lately? Are your prayers more like, "Speak Lord for your servant is listening" or "Listen Lord, for your servant is speaking?"









2nd Sunday Ordinary Time

When you go to Mass, you are not simply "going to church." You are about to encounter God in the most profound way possible here on earth. God is going to speak to you—really—through the inspired words of the Sacred Scripture, which are proclaimed in the Liturgy of the Word. Will you be prepared to have the ears to hear him?

Honestly, we don't always experience the Mass this way. We may find it boring and dry at times—it might seem like just a bunch of random, empty rituals. We may be disappointed by the priest's homily or the music or the architecture of the church. We may not experience a warm and welcoming community. Or maybe we are too distracted at Mass; our minds wander, and our hearts are not in it.

God, nevertheless, works through all these messy human realities and wants to encounter us at every mass, no matter what the circumstances may be. For the Mass is the primary place Jesus wants to meet us, heal us, and transform us. And it is the primary place Jesus calls us to worship Him and give our lives entirely to Him.

Indeed, the Mass is nothing less than the celebration of the Eucharist Jesus instituted at the Last Supper, when he commands his apostles, "Do this in remembrance of me."

All that happens in the Mass cannot easily be summarized in a brief sentence or two, for the entire mystery of our salvation is bound up with the Eucharistic Liturgy. But to help our minds begin to grasp the depths of the Mass, we will briefly consider three key aspects of the Eucharist that every Catholic should know:

- 1) The Eucharist as the memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the cross
- 2) The Eucharist as the real presence of the Jesus and
- 3) The Eucharist as Holy Communion with our Lord. (to be continued ...)
