2024-2025 PRE-REGISTRATION FORM

It is hard to believe we are making preparations for the next school year. We anticipate that our enrollment will continue to increase next school year. We already have many new families interested in SAS for next year. It is important to turn in your Pre-Registration form and fee in a timely manner to ensure your child is included in our enrollment for next year. This also helps us to plan the budget for the upcoming year, as well as class sizes and number of teachers needed.

Current families risk being put on a waiting list if the Pre-Registration form is not returned by the deadline!

The registration fee of \$75 per student AND the registration form is due by January 26, 2024. After January 26th, the registration fee will increase to \$100. The registration fee is non-refundable. After January 26, we will also open registration for new families.

How Sick is too Sick?

This information sheet is designed to be used as a general guidance for parents. If parents have medical questions, they are encouraged to consult with a healthcare provider.

Symptom	Send to School	Keep at Home	
Fever	During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been below 100.4 degrees and no fever-reducing medication has been taken.	During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been more than 100.4 degrees.	
Diarrhea	During the past 24 hours, no more than one watery stool has occurred.	During the past 24 hours, more than one watery stool has occurred.	
Vomiting	During the past 24 hours, no vomiting has occurred.	During the past 24 hours, vomiting has occurred.	
Eye Irritation	Eyes may be itchy, but are not red, crusty, or draining.	Eyes are pink, draining, crusty, itching, painful, sensitive to light, or student has vision changes.	
Cough/Runny Nose	Slight cough or runny nose, but no fever, and the student is able to cover cough, blow nose, and wash hands.	Symptoms are severe enough that the student is unable to learn. The student has a fever, or is unable to cover cough, blow nose, or wash hands.	
Rash	Rash is not draining or spreading. The student does not have a fever, and symptoms of itching are not severe enough to impede learning.	Rash is bothersome and distracting. The student has a fever or severe itching, or rash is spreading or draining.	
Asthma	Symptoms are well controlled, and the student knows when to contact a school adult for assistance or the student has an asthma action plan on file at the school and is following the plan.	Symptoms are not well controlled. The student is not able to recognize when he/she needs assistance, and no asthma action plan is on file at the school.	

Please remember that students must be fever free for 24 hours, without fever reducing medications, in order to return to school. If a student is vomiting or has diarrhea, then students need to be free of vomiting and diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school. Please, Please, Please do not send your child to school if they are not feeling well. We want everyone to do their part in keeping everyone healthy and safe.



Part II continued from 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time

To help our minds begin to grasp the depths of the Mass, we will briefly consider three key aspects of the Eucharist that every Catholic should know:

- 1) The Eucharist as the memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the cross,
- 2) The Eucharist as the real presence of Jesus and
- 3) The Eucharist as Holy Communion with our Lord.
- 1) Have you ever heard the celebration of the Eucharist called "the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass"? One might wonder, in what sense is the Mass a sacrifice? This is, admittedly, not easy to see. After all, Catholics do not go to Mass as the ancient Jews went to the Temple, bringing animals to the sanctuary to be slain, cut up, burned, and offered to God by a priest. The sacrifice taking place in the Mass is clearly not one of cattle, sheep, or goats. It does however, involve a real sacrifice - the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who in His death on the Cross offered His lite as a total gift to the Father and redeemed the world. This is crucial to understand – and absolutely amazing to realize! The Mass does not merely recall or symbolize Jesus' death on the Cross. It sacramentally makes present Christ's redeeming sacrifice, so that its saving power may

be more fully applied to our lives. In other words, the Mass is not simply about reverently remembering Christ's death on Calvary, like a civil holiday remembrance ceremony. It actually makes that saving event present to us so that we may enter into it. When we go to Mass, we in a very real sense go to Calvary, for the mystery of Calvary is made present to us sacramentally. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "In the divine sacrifice which is celebrated the Mass, the same Christ who offered Himself once in a bloody manner to the altar of the Cross is contained and offered in an unbloody manner" (CCC#1367) (to be continued ...)
