


Our annual Christmas Program will be on Thursday, December 11 at 6:30.

You will need to do the following:

- Sign up for an audition time slot
- Fill out an audition form (available from Mr. Holley or online)
- Pick up an audition packet and choose a song or character to practice (Characters on back of this page) – be sure to read through all of them for familiarity!
- Download and begin listening to music via the online link. Contact the production team if you can't find it.
- **Learn and practice the excerpt from the song, *Let It Go* (titled "Bows" in the audition packet).** Everyone who auditions will sing this song in a small group.
- **If auditioning for a solo singing role:** Choose a song to sing from the list below. Sheet music is included in your audition packet. If you wish to audition for a solo role, you should prepare a song below to perform for us. (Just a short section, not the whole song- see sheet music hand out).

Things to know:

- Auditions are open to students in 5th – 8th grade. Can't sing? Don't dance? No problem! There will be roles for the first timer up to the next Broadway star.
- If you would like to audition, a sign-up sheet and materials will be available in the music room. Students will sign up for a time slot and only need to be present during their scheduled time.
- First round of auditions will be held on November 17, with a few backup slots on November 18 if needed. Callbacks will be held Tuesday, November 18. Callbacks will be notified Monday evening (or immediately after their audition on Tuesday). **All Auditions will be held in the Parish/Social Hall Gym. Plan to drop off and pick up students at PARISH GYM doors.**
- There will be a \$40 fee collected at the **first rehearsal on Monday, November 24 2:45 - 4:30**. This helps pay for rights to the show, sets, some of the costumes, show t-shirt, etc. There will be some items that are not included in the \$40 fee and will need to be purchased separately. If the cost is a hardship, please don't let that deter you from auditioning. Let us know and we will make it work out.
- Rehearsal dates are still TBD, however most will be weekdays right after school and maybe some Saturday mornings if needed. **Not every cast member will need to be at every rehearsal.** A detailed schedule for the first few weeks will be distributed at the first rehearsal. Our goal will be to post rehearsal schedules at least 2 weeks in advance.
- Mandatory dates: All rehearsals should be considered "mandatory". A cast is a team, and it is difficult on everyone when even one person is missing. However, dates that **cannot** be missed (unless due to illness) are February 16-20 (tech week) and performances on February 21 & 22.


Go Forth


Have you ever felt frustrated or defeated when prayers seem unanswered and challenges mount? Today's readings challenge us to place our trust in the Lord and persevere in His mission. In Exodus, Moses stands on a hill, arms raised in prayer as Israel battles Amalek and his people. When Moses grows tired, Aaron and Hur hold up his arms to secure victory. This scene reminds us that we are called to lift each other up as community, trusting in God's power. St. Paul's words to Timothy urge us to proclaim the Word boldly, whether it is convenient or not. Our mission is to carry God's truth to a world that often rejects it, teaching and encouraging others with patience. In today's Gospel, Jesus' parable about the persistent widow reinforces this call, reassuring us to pray without ceasing, trust in God's timing, and believe that He responds to every cry. Ultimately, each of these readings invite us to take tangible steps in living our mission as disciples.

Every year, we ask you to renew your commitment to Christ's mission in the Church through our parish Stewardship Renewal. This also includes the opportunity to come together through the United Catholic Appeal to reach beyond our parish boundaries to support vital ministries and transform lives across the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. Over the next several weeks you will be receiving your Stewardship Renewal materials in the mail. I encourage you to prayerfully discern how God is calling you to Go Forth to bring Christ to others through your prayer, personal witness, and financial gifts. Let us pray that we may always open our hearts to the action of the Holy Spirit, supporting one another, proclaiming the Gospel courageously, and praying tirelessly, so that we may "Go Forth" to live for Christ and to make Him known in how we love, serve, and care for others.


