

Mt. 4:19 "Follow me," he told them, "and I will make you fishers of people!"

Are you one of the sneaky culprits?

You've almost certainly seen it. Dining and dashing. It's a problem also in church when people receive communion... and then immediately leave Mass before it's finished. Please **STOP** doing this!

The Mass is the "source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324) It is the representation of the one holy sacrifice of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is Jesus Christ Himself, really, truly, and substantially present. Mass is the most important thing we do every week! Especially relevant, the Mass is one thing. It is one big, long prayer. Yes, there are parts, but they all go together, and "going to Mass" means going to all of it. We're not called to simply "get communion" and leave. Thanking Jesus after receiving communion, the final prayers, announcements and the dismissal are all essential parts of Mass! "But what if I have a really good reason to leave early?" Of course, if you have a good reason you're leaving early, you can leave early. Maybe an emergency just came up. But emergencies are not normative, they are exceptional. I fear many Catholics are leaving early because it's become their habit. They get the Eucharist, they think they're done, and they can bolt early. They've never been corrected or told otherwise... so why would they stop?

We need to stop tolerating this kind of spiritual mediocrity. Mass is important, and if you want to be Catholic the Church requires us to attend Mass every Sunday (or Saturday evening) and Holy Day of Obligation. This means, barring a really good reason, being there on time and staying until the very end. You are depriving yourself of the final blessing, which is essential for the next week, and praying double by singing the closing hymn, which has been planned just for you. Why walk out on that?

The bottom line is this: when we go to Mass that means staying until the very end. If you've been in the habit of leaving early, let's intentionally stop that and stay for the whole thing. Because God is worth it!

Lastly some people are practicing intinction that is reserved for only very rare circumstances. Here is what the Archdiocese of Indianapolis states in their Sacramental & Department of the Consecrated bread into the cup) is to be reserved for extraordinary circumstances since it removes the option of receiving communion in the hand. The dipping of the consecrated bread into the cup by the communicant is not to be practiced."
