


NEW FISCAL YEAR BRINGS NEW GOALS

Where we are today, how we got here and where we

After being relatively stable for the past few years in October 2020 steel prices across the board began a precipitous rise.

Since October 2020:

Wide Flange +93% Plate +200% Angle/Channel +50% HSS Tubing +270%

Also during the same time period Joist and Deck prices have increased 360%

AVAILABILITY:

Wide Flange: Mills are running at 80-90% maximum capacity and have product readily available. Mill rollings are filling up earlier so lead times are increasing 2-4 weeks.

Plate: Plate mills are running at maximum capacity and are on allocation to all customers. We have begun ordering plate earlier in the process to assure it is available when needed for fabrication. Plate is interesting because it is used in so many other products like Automotive and Appliances so if the economy overall is good demand is very high.

Angle/Channel: Mills are running 80-90% maximum capacity and have product readily available.

HSS Tubing: This product is made from plate so the availability of tubing can be a problem as mills struggle to get raw material. Tubing is rolled on demand so pricing is only good for 15 days and is very volatile.


Joist/Deck: Lead times have increased from 12 weeks to 24-30 weeks.

LOGISTICS:

We continue to see trucking problems across the whole supply chain, getting raw materials from the mills and getting finished product to the job sites. Shipments have been delayed searching for trucks to carry loads. Freight prices have increased 50-60%. We have seen improvement in the last few weeks as more truck drivers get off the unemployment rolls and back to work.

FUTURE:

Demand for all steel products continues to be strong however we think prices have peaked and will begin an adjustment to lower levels in the near future. How much lower depends on many factors including general economic health, amount of imported steel, new mills coming on line etc.




