EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING 2026

Traditionally conducted by the head of the household. Using the blessed chalk that you brought with you from church, you will write numbers, letters, and crosses on the lintel of your home's front door (and any other door you wish) while reciting a prayer. The end result should look something like this, ideally centered over the door:

20 + C + M + B + 26

The prayer follows below; read it through beforehand and try to visualize the spacing and positioning of the letters so that you have a beautiful outcome! The inscription may be written either on the outside or inside of the home. The C stands for Casper, M for Melchior and B for Balthasar (the three wiseman) – and for Christus Mansionem Benedicat, which is Latin for “May Christ Bless this House”.

As you are writing, pray the following prayer: “In the name of the + Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Let us pray. God, incline your ear. Bless us and all who are gathered here. Send your holy angel, who will defend us, and fill with grace all who dwell here. May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.”

In conclusion, you may wish to sing the carol, ‘We Three Kings’. This remains throughout the year as a reminder that your home is a Catholic and Christian home. “As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord!” (Joshua 24:15). It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk at the Masses for the Epiphany, and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year. The many blessings connected with the Church's liturgical cycle and feasts are important ways for us to sanctify our homes and our lives throughout the year and benefit from special graces along our way. Be sure to keep the chalk for next year!
