Year 5 and 6 Bikeability Training

Our Year 5 and 6 pupils kicked off the week with their Bikeability Level 2 training. Building on their previous Level 1 skills, the children worked with qualified instructors to develop their confidence and cycling abilities. Sessions focused on practising techniques at school, before pupils put their skills to the test by cycling on the roads around our village, experiencing cycling conditions on public roads.

Phonics Parent Workshop

This week, Mrs Davies welcomed our Reception and Year 1 parents and carers to a Phonics Parent Workshop. The session provided an insight into how we teach phonics and early reading at Guilden Morden. 






Message from Guilden Morden School Council
