Additional Information – Acorn Class (Rec/KS1)

We would like to give you some additional information on how the Acorn class will be structured next year. Within this mixed Reception, Yr 1 and Yr2 class, all pupils will continue to be supported and challenged. We have a very effective curriculum that we have developed and embedded over the years to ensure that it works well within our mixed age groups. Pupils will continue to work through the planned curriculum. We have ensured that we allocate support staff in Acorn class to differentiate the provision between year groups, and also to ensure that teaching can take place separately. We are carefully planning the classrooms ahead of September so that we can cater for the mixed year groups, with dedicated and differentiated learning spaces. We are confident that these steps will help all our children thrive and feel secure as they move up next year.
