Staying Safe as the Seasons Change -continued Cycling Safely in Autumn and Winter

Be Weather Wise

- Check the forecast before heading out
- If it's icy or stormy, consider walking or using alternative transport
- On milder days, waterproof layers and a warm hat under helmets work well
- Make sure children can hear traffic as well as see it

Pack Smart Keep a small kit in school bags:

- Spare gloves
- A reflective rain cover
- A snack for energy
- A plastic bag for muddy shoes or wet gear

Buddy Up

- Cycling with a friend or sibling is safer and more fun
- Children can help each other stay visible and alert
- It's a great way to start the day with fresh air and conversation

Stay Seen, Stay Safe

- Use lights even in the morning and late afternoon
- Wear something bright
- Reflective ankle bands are excellent for moving visibility
- Decorate bikes with reflective stickers or colourful spoke lights

Watch for Slippery Surfaces

- Be aware of wet leaves and frost
- Ride slower in these conditions
- Check tyre grip regularly
- Make sure brakes work properly

Bike Maintenance

- Clean off grit regularly
- Lubricate chains
- Inspect brakes and lights
- Choose well-lit, familiar routes

General Safety Tips

- Make eye contact at junctions
- Avoid distractions
- Plan safer routes, avoiding flood-prone areas
- Stay alert and aware of your surroundings





With the right preparation and awareness, we can all help keep our children safe as they travel to and from school during these darker months.
