As the president of Jazzheads, the New York City based jazz label, it has been my honor to collaborate with the talented students and teachers from Manhattan School of Music's Jazz Arts department in creating some of the best recordings Jazzheads has released to date.

Jazzheads' mission is to release the highest quality recordings of improvised music. MSM's Jazz Arts department has a similar mission, which is to teach highlevel musicianship and develop excellent improvising musicians. Jazz Arts Chair Justin DiCioccio finds and trains students who will be the next leaders in the world of jazz and chooses important historical repertoire to perform and record. Under the leadership of Bobby Sanabria, the MSM Afro-Cuban Jazz Orchestra has been honed into a tight musical machine. The grooves the band plays are infectious and at the same time pay homage to the grand lineage of the music.

Together MSM and Jazzheads have set a new standard in releasing CDs from a university music department. Please understand that it is very unusual for a recording company to collaborate with a music school. It is even more extraordinary for the two of them to release such a fine array of recordings. But MSM and JH have done this together—producing CDs that deserve the worldwide recognition they are receiving.

This special collaboration began with a meeting I had with the multi-talented, multi-Grammy nominated, drummer, percussionist, and educator, Bobby Sanabria who suggested that Jazzheads release live recordings of MSM's jazz concerts. In all honesty, I wasn't that enthused about the idea. How good could a college band's recordings sound? How would they stand up to the competition of the ever tightening jazz scene? And how and where would we promote such a product? For the most part, college band recordings are less than stellar. Usually the production of the recordings is not up to the industry standard and the music is not played up to a

professional standard. But, that night, in his car, Bobby played a live unmixed recording from the Kenya Revisited Live!!! CD. I was immediately captured by the intensity of the music. I couldn't believe this was a college band! It sounded and felt like pros were playing it. And, trust me, this is difficult music to play and interpret. This music hooked me. He also told me that Justin DiCioccio had similarly impressive recordings of the MSM Jazz Philharmonic, Gil Evans tribute concerts featuring Dave Liebman





in the historical role of the great Miles Davis. This was all starting to get very interesting! So, I decided to move forward. Little did I know what a wonderful musical adventure it would be.

When I met with Justin
DiCioccio to discuss the details,
I was extremely pleased that we
both strongly agreed we would
only release the best played
and recorded music and never
compromise.

Lastly, we decided that we wanted a portion of the proceeds from the sales of the CDs to go to the MSM Scholarship fund, to reinvest in the future of the form, reinvest in jazz.

Our latest releases—The Symphonic Ellington and ¡Qué Viva Harlem!—should be in any serious jazz listener's collection. They are garnering excellent reviews and airplay.

Congrats to the MSM team who have believed in this project and have made it all happen! Debra Kinzler, Stephanie Crease, Majel Peters, Paul Kelleher, Dr. James Gandre, Bobby Sanabria, and Justin DiCioccio, it has been my pleasure to collaborate with you.

We will continue to expand the catalog and amaze the skeptics who can't believe student ensembles can be this musical. •
